The Southern Baptist Convention met in annual session at Pittsburgh June 14-16. Among the actions taken were SBC these directly affecting Southeastern:

> -Approved a 1983-84 budget for \$125,000,000 Southeastern receives:

> > Operating Funds -----\$3,707,795 Challenge Budget -Phase I --- 750,000 Challenge Budget -Phase II 1,302,415 (Both Challenge Budgets are Pro-rated among 6 seminaries).

- -Adopted the 1984-88 Capital Needs Budget, which includes \$2,703,333 for six Southeastern projects, including our pro-rated share of the new SBC Building.
- -Approved a Maximum Contingency Reserve Fund for Southeastern amounting to 1/3 of our annual budget.

-Elected Jerry Holcomb, (VA) to the Board of Trustees as well as re-electing Mark Caldwell, Gene Curtis, Frank Jordan, Charles Page, and Harold Stinson. These trustees were elected for a five year term to expire in 1988.

The Alumni luncheon in Pittsburgh was an overwhelming success. Bill Self, class of '57, Atlanta, Ga., assumed the office of President of the ALUMNI LUNCHEON Alumni Association. Marion Lark, class of '61, Henderson, N. C., was named President-elect.
