BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS (1) There is again a limited amount of storage space available in the gym. This space is assigned on a first come basis. If interested contact the Buildings and Grounds office, ext. 260.

(2) Emergency calls - nights, weekends, holidays: The Buildings and Grounds office is open from 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday except during official Seminary holidays. With the exception of our watchmen, all personnel are scheduled and available for work during these hours each week. Occasionally, a situation may develop that requires attention during off-duty hours.
