ACCREDITATION

Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary is fully accredited by the American Association of Theological Schools.

REGISTRATION

FIRST TERM—Monday, June 16, 1969. Classes will meet four days each week, Tuesday through Friday, beginning Tuesday, June 17. Two courses may be taken. Four semester hours credit may be earned in four weeks. Matriculation and schedule changing closes June 18, 4:00 p.m.

SECOND TERM—Monday, July 14, 1969. Classes will meet four days each week, Tuesday through Friday, beginning Tuesday, July 15. Two courses may be taken. Four semester hours credit may be earned in four weeks. Matriculation and schedule changing closes July 16, 4:00 p.m.

COSTS

Fees \$20.00 per term. Rooms \$20.00 per term. Meals, approximately \$2.20 per day, may be secured in the cafeteria. The cost of books and supplies varies, depending upon the courses taken.

FACILITIES

Air-conditioned library and class rooms. Modern dormitory facilities are available for men and women. Married couples should write the Business Office concerning housing accommodations for the summer session.

RECREATION

Golf, Tennis, Swimming, Gymnasium. The town of Wake Forest operates a modern swimming pool. A nine-hole golf course within walking distance of the campus is available for a modest fee. The Seminary gymnasium will be open. Tennis courts are also available.

CURRICULUM

FIRST TERM, June 16-July 11, 1969

A course in elementary Hebrew, designed for beginners in the Hebrew Old Testament, will meet *four hours each day for six weeks* and will enable the student to earn six semester hours in Hebrew.

The student who does not take the course in Hebrew may enroll in two courses and earn four semester hours each term.

The student who elects to take M 366s the first term will earn five semester hours.

In order to maintain a reasonable student-teacher ratio, the Seminary reserves the right to control the size of classes offered in the summer session.

B 115s BIBLICAL HEBREW Mr. Hamrick
An introduction to the fundamentals of classical Hebrew with primary emphasis on the strong verb and basic vocabulary.
3 semester hours 7:30-9:30, 10:30-12:30, Tuesday through Friday

B 243s THE EXPOSITION OF GREAT TEXTS IN THE NEW TESTAMENT Mr. Cook
Several of the great passages will be examined lexically, syntactically, historically, and contextually.
2 semester hours 7:30-9:30, Tuesday through Friday

T 206s THE DOCTRINE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT Mr. Eddins
A survey of the Biblical teaching and doctrinal development of the Spirit of God. Attention will be given to fundamental theological problems of the doctrine of the Spirit.
2 semester hours 7:30-9:30, Tuesday through Friday

M 366s SEMINAR ON URBAN STUDIES Mr. Bland & Mr. Copeland
A study of structures and problems of the secular city, including an evaluation of efforts toward renewal of the churches.
5 semester hours 8:30-12:30, Monday through Friday

H 207s CHRISTIAN CLASSICS AND BIOGRAPHY Mr. Shriver
Studies in selected classic source materials from all periods of church history with special attention given to the careers of the authors of the chosen works.
2 semester hours 10:30-12:30, Tuesday through Friday

M 262s THE CHANGING SOUTHERN COMMUNITY Mr. Hendricks
A study of basic social changes and an evaluation of the ways they affect community life in the southern regions of the United States.
2 semester hours 10:30-12:30, Tuesday through Friday

SECOND TERM, July 14-August 8, 1969

B 116s BIBLICAL HEBREW Mr. Hamrick
A continuation of B 115s with emphasis on the weak verb. (Since this class meets four hours a day, the course will be concluded July 25.)
3 semester hours 7:30-9:30, 10:30-12:30, Tuesday through Friday

M 209s POST-REFORMATION PREACHING Mr. Carlton
A study of the theological trends and significant personalities in the preaching tradition from the sixteenth century to the present.
2 semester hours 7:30-9:30, Tuesday through Friday

B 245s GALATIANS Mr. Nations
A study of the Letter to the Galatians in its historical setting in the life of Paul, utilizing the English text.
2 semester hours 10:30-12:30, Tuesday through Friday

M 256s INTRODUCTION TO CHURCH MUSIC

Mr. Smith

A survey course covering the use of music in worship, Christian hymnody, and church music administration, designed primarily for students interested in the pastoral ministry.
