## TOURNAMENT TIME

Gore Gymnasium will be popping with action this week as a sellout crowd is expected to witness the battle between the top four teams in the NCC (Neuse Coast Conference) Pairings for the tournament are made by ranking according to regular season standings. Johnson's Crawlers 7-1, Dowis' Tigers 6-2, Finch's Deacons 3-5, and Teaster's Eagles 0-8.

The tourney begins Tuesday March 4 with the Crawlers meeting the Eagles. On Thursday the Tigers meet the Deacons, with the winners meeting next Tuesday for the Championship.

The following are exclusive interviews with the conference coaches relating their tournament hopes.

Joe (Bones McKinney) Johnson: "Our main worry while waiting for next week's tourney is over confidence. While we recognize that we have lost only one game, and that we have an overwhelming height advantage, and that we are shooting with the best percentage in the conference and that we have excellent bench strength, and that we are in excellent physical condition we must realize that there is a possibility of an upset(?). We are counting very heavily on the work of Davis (Hoss) Langford, Jay (Jerry Lucas) Overbay and Jayne (Gunner) Coley."

Joe (Red Auenbach) Dowjs: "Through my years of coaching experience I realize that anything can happen in a tournement. I think that our pairing with the Deacons makes our job rougher in that they ca. be tough but good guys never win so our boys should have an advantage. I think that we have the strongest pair of guards in the conference with Temple (Charlie Scott) Myers and Charlie (Dick Grubur) Page, and stand a good chance of upsetting the Crawlers unless we get caught using our famous Carolina defense."

Curt (Frank McGuire) Finch: "B the grace of Santa Claus and the roll of the dice I feel confident of our chances of victory. On several occasions we have looked good this year (well, once at least).

Our hopes lie on the scoring of Ron (Nike Maloy) Medlin--the league's leading scorer. We will be out there to win but we will not sacrifice our integrity for a silly basketball game (unless they throw the first punch)."

Dick (Bill Tate) Teaster: "I think we have had the material this year but if we don't win the tourney I will be forced to resign my coaching position at Wake Forest. Ronnie (Charlie Davis) Davis and Stan (Hack) Mock are key figures in our success in tournament games. Jim (Pete Maravich) Montsinger and Skip (Flip) Coleman could make the difference."
