5th, Elder John Stadler, chosen Moderator.

6th, Chose to preach to-morrow, Lord's day; Elders C. B. Hassel, J. H. Daniel, and A. W. Eans; and Elders William Burns, Josiah Simth and Benj. Bynam, on Monday.

7th, Agreed, that brethren Major Green and E. K. Withers be appointed a com-

mittee of finance.

8th, Agreed, that CB Hassel, William Burns and Drury Seat, with the moderator and clerk, be appointed at committee to prepare the business for Monday.

9th, Agreed, to adjourn untill Monday morning, 9 o'clock.

SUNDAY MORNING, 19TH. 10 O'clock.

10th, Met a large congregation, who were entertained by the following brethren—Elder A. W. Eans opened the service of the day from the 1st Epistle General of John, 3rd chapter, 1st verse: "Behold what manner of love the father hath bestowed upon us, that we should be called the sous of God; therefore, the world knoweth us not, because it knew him not." Elder Willis Wells and brethren E J Hester and Sidney O'Bryant, to White Oak; also, Elder John Stadler, to Kehuke; also, Elder William Burns and brethren Richard Jones, Hyram Lockard, John Harris, Benjamin Willis and E K Withers, to Staunton River; also, Elders William Burns, and James Wilder, and brother William I. Gilliam, to Pig River.

16th, Agreed, that Elders John Stadler, William Burns and Willis Wells, be appointed to attend a Section Meeting at Flat River Meeting House, Person county, N.
