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#### PROCEEDINGS OF ELK RIVER ASSOCIATION.

after paying for the printing and distributing the minutes.

Eld. W. A. Cashion was requested to preach the next introductory sermon to be held at Arbor Church, Moore county, Tenn., six miles south-east of Lynchburg, beginning on Friday before the second Sunday in September, 1910.

The association, on motion, extended to the brethren, sisters and friends of the community thanks for their kind hospitality during the meeting.

Minutes read and approved.

The association having gone through the session in peace, sung a song and gave each other the right hand of christian love and fellowship. Received the benediction by Eld. W. A. Cashion.

#### ARTICLES OF FAITH.

- 1. We believe in only one true and living God, and that there was a Trinity of persons in the Godhead, the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, and that there are not three Gods, but one only.
- 2. We believe that the scripture of the Old and New Testaments are the words of God and the only true rules of faith and practice
- 3. We believe in the fall of Adam, and by his transgressions all his posterity fell and were made sinners. We believe in the corruption of human nature and in the impotency of man to recover himself by his own free will and ability.
- 4. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by the righteousness of Christ imputed to them and good works are the fruits of faith and follow after justification, and are evidences of our gracious state,
- 5. We believe that the Saints will persevere in grace and that not one of them will be finally lost.
- 6. We believe that there will be a resurrection of the dead, and a general or universal judgement and that the happiness of the righteous and punishment of the wicked will be eternal.
- 7. We believe that the visible Church of Christ is a congregation of faithful men and women, who have given themselves to the Lord, and have obtained fellowship with each other, and have agreed to keep a Godly discipline, according to the rules of the Gospel.
- 8. We believe that Jesus Christ is the great head of the Church and that the government is with the body.
- 9. We believe that water Baptism, the Lord's Supper and washing the saint's feet are ordinances of the Gospel, and to be continued until His second coming.
- 10. We believe that true believers are the only fit subjects for baptism and immersion is the only gospel mode.
- 11. We believe that none but the regularly baptised persons have a right to commune at the Lord's table.
- 12. We believe that the Lord's Day ought to be observed and set apart for the worship of God and that no work or worldly business should be transacted thereon—works of piety and mercy and neces sity excepted.
