The annual pastors' seminar and chaplains' conference were held on campus, February 11-13, in connection with the Adams Lectures by Dr. David H. C. Reid. The pastors had 140 persons registered and the chaplains had 95 for these significant continuing education events.

Over 240 registrants, including college students from 30 campuses in the southeastern United States, participated in the annual Student Conference on Missions and Ministry which was held on our campus February 22-24. The weekend event centered around the theme, "Christ Thrust: Power to Serve." Conference leaders included Anthony Campolo, noted sociologist and missions interpreter; John Mills, Foreign Mission Board West Africa director; and Mildred McWhorter, Home Mission Board director of 3 Houston, Texas inner city mission centers: Bible studies by Richard Spencer, dramatic presentations by Doug Berky and special music by Drexel Rayford and Mike Pittman and Michael Hawn were integral parts of the program. Other features included 20 special interest seminars and a workshop for Campus Ministers. The theme of the 1986 Conference will be "Because He Gives...I Become" and will be held February 14-16.
