## Club History, 1958 - 1959

The history of our Club for the past year will reflect many accomplishments, achievements, and highlights for the year.

One of the highlights of our year was the reception held in July 1958 honoring our new doctor and his wife, Dr. and Mrs. A. N. Corpening. The Lions Club and Home Demonstration Club joined us in presenting Dr. Corpening a desk for his office.

Our major projects and activities during the year have been:

1. Building of Girl Scout Hut and dedication of building to which public was invited. This project was in conjunction with Finer Carolina Program.
2. Sponsoring two Girl Scout Troops and Brownie Scout Troop; entertained each Troop with a Christmas Party.
3. Care and improvement of Community House.
4. Our Club, along with the Lions Club, Mayor and Town Commissioners, purchased a refrigerator for use in our Community House.
5. Awarding Citizenship Medal to most outstanding citizen in the senior class of the Youngsville High School.
6. Presentation of Silver Bowl to a club member doing outstanding work in our Club and Community.
7. Assistance in the way of clothes, furniture, and money was provided for needy families.

8. There were fifteen poinsettias and three fruit baskets presented to our "Shut-Ins" at Christmas time. Also "Get-Well" and "Sympathy" cards were sent to any ill or bereaved in the community during the year.

Our Club was represented at the Council Institute, President's Institute, District Meeting, and State Convention. We received special recognition in the District and State for having the largest number of subscribers to the National Club Woman's magazine on percentage basis of club membership. The District award was a bronze plaque and the State award we received was a silver tray. Our Club Year Book and Scrap Book both took first place and won blue ribbons in our District. At the District Meeting we were presented with a Certificate of Honor for having a 100% club.

During the past year we have been host to the faculty of Youngsville High School, County Superintendent of Schools, Franklinton Woman's Club, Presidents of Henderson and Warrenton Clubs, our District President and Vice President, and State First Vice President.

The financial needs of our Club were met by the sale of fruit cakes, pen sets, and knives.

Guest speaker for our annual Club Banquet on June 16, 1959, was Mrs. Frances Jarman Radio Station WDNC, Durham, N. C. On this occasion Mrs. J. M. Royster, President of District Fourteen, installed the officers for the coming year.

## Constitution and By-Laws

### ARTICLE I—Name

The name of this organization shall be known as the Youngsville Woman's Club.

### ARTICLE II—Object

The object of this organization shall be to bring together those who are interested in the advancement of civic affairs of any nature with the purpose of promoting good citizenship.

### ARTICLE III—Members

Section 1. Any person who is interested in the objectives of this organization shall be eligible to membership. The name of an applicant for membership must be presented by a member to the membership chairman and in turn the membership chairman must present to the club for approval.

Section 2. Each member shall be expected to serve in at least one department.

Section 3. The dues of this organization shall be \$5.00, payable in advance on or before the October meeting. The club Treasurer shall remit \$1.50 per member to the State Federation and 10c per member to the Ten-Penny Art Fund.

Section 4. Any member shall be automatically dropped from this organization if dues are not paid on or before October meeting.

Section 5. Any member coming in later than ten minutes after the hour of meeting shall be fined 10c.

## ARTICLE IV—Officers

Section 1. The officers of this organization shall be a President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, and a Treasurer. The First and Second Vice Presidents will automatically be elevated and the Second Vice President and remaining officers will be elected at the January meeting. Installation of officers will be held at the June meeting. All officers shall hold office for one year.

Section 2. The Executive Board will be made of the immediate past President, Officers, and Chairmen of Standing Committees. It shall have the power to transact business which requires attention, between regular meetings of the club.

Section 3. Duties of Officers: a. President — The President shall preside at all standing committee meetings, restrict debate within the rules of order, appoint all standing committees, and call special meetings when necessary. She shall be entitled to vote when the vote is by ballot and in all cases when her vote would change the result. She shall be Ex Officio Chairman of the Executive Board. She must present her yearly report at the annual business meeting in May. Before the annual convention for the N. C. Federation of Women's Clubs, the President shall answer the questionnaire which is sent annually to the club by the Chairman of the District of the State Federation. This questionnaire shall be included in the President's report to the club. At the March meeting delegates and alternates to the N. C. Federation of Women's

Clubs shall be appointed. All delegates shall be instructed. The President shall also appoint a nominating committee of three active members at the December meeting and receive their report at the January meeting. It shall also be the duty of the President to appoint one member to audit the treasurer's record by the June meeting.

b. Vice President—The Vice President shall perform all duties of the President in her absence. In the absence of both President and First Vice President, the Second Vice President will preside.

c. Recording Secretary — The Recording Secretary shall keep the roll, minutes, and all other records of the club. She shall notify each member of all called meetings as directed by the President, stating the purpose for which the meeting is called.

d. Corresponding Secretary — The Corresponding Secretary conducts all correspondence of the club, and shall report briefly at each meeting any news from "The Club Woman" of club activities. She shall send notes of congratulations, sympathy, convalescence, etc., to club members when the occasion arises.

e. Treasurer — The Treasurer shall collect dues, account for and disburse the funds of the club under the direction of the President. She shall serve notice on all delinquents at the proper time and shall make a statement of accounts at each regular meeting and at the annual business meeting shall render a written report.

## ARTICLE V—Meetings

Section 1. Regular meetings shall be held on the third Tuesday evening of each month at 8:00 o'clock.

Section 2. The organization shall have ten meetings beginning in September; ending in June. The December meeting shall be a special Christmas program (or party) and the June meeting in the form of a social and installation of officers.

Section 3. The regular meeting in May shall be the annual meeting and shall be for the purpose of reporting any other business that may arise.

Section 4. A quorum shall consist of one-third active members of the organization.

## ARTICLE VI—Miscellaneous

Section 1. There shall be the following standing committees: Finance, Membership, Press and Publicity, Program, Project, Resolutions and Revisions, Scrap Book, Year Book, Birthday Remembrance, Help a Home, and Community House.

Section 2. The expense of the President for attending the Convention of the North Carolina Federation of Women's Clubs shall be paid by the club.

## ARTICLE VII—Parliamentary Authority

The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order, Revised, shall govern this organization in all cases to which they are applicable and which they are not inconsistent with these By-Laws.

## ARTICLE VIII—Amendments to the By-Laws

These By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the organization by a two-thirds vote, provided notice was given at the previous meeting.
