SPECIAL COURSE WITH GEORGE GAGLIARDI: George Gagliardi, guitarist, composer and popular Baptist Student Union program personality will be on our campus for the next two semesters as special student and Student Artist. Mr. Gagliardi will offer a non-credit course on "Theological Reflections on Popular Culture." The course will be open to any member of our seminary family. Those interested in this course are asked to meet with Mr. Gagliardi on Tuesday, January 25, following the chapel service to discuss final plans for this course.

I.D. CARDS: Students who had I.D. pictures made during registration may pick up their cards at the Student Activities office, second floor, Mackie Hall.

PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES: The Wake County Tax Supervisor has informed the Seminary of a stricter enforcement of the N.C. law regarding the listing of personal property. This states that a student's personal property is subject to taxation even if he dwells at two or more places during the year. The place for listing personal property is the place at which the student dwelt the longest during the calendar year immediately preceding January 1, 1977. Personal property may be listed without a late penalty charge between January 3 and February 15, 1977. To determine if you are liable for Wake County taxes, or for more information, contact the Tax Supervisor, Room 803, Wake County Courthouse in Raleigh or call 755-6550. Wake Forest city taxes are automatically figured from the county listings.
