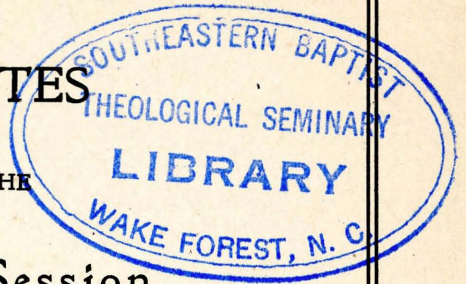

7th. We thank the people of Cusseta and vicinity who so kindly cared for us during this meeting, and pray that this meeting may leave a lingering influence that will be a blessing in their church, in their homes and in their lives.

8th. Read Minutes and adjourned.
