# Proceedings.

TUESDAY, August 4, 1896.

The Beulah Association met in its sixty-second annual session with the Beulah Baptist Church on Tuesday, August 4th, 1896.

#### REPORT ON STATE MISSIONS.

Your committe on State Missions beg leave to report that during the past year God has graciously blessed the work of our Misionaries all over the State. Reports show that more people have been baptized into Baptist churches during the last twelve months than ever before in our history.

We have 94 missionaries working in 30 Associations.

The Board under the instructions from the Convention has appropriated \$15,000 to the work this year. Up to date we have not been able to pay our missionaries, but are hopeful that the churches will come up with liberal contributions during the next three months

God has laid the responsibility of giving the Gospel to North Carolina on our shoulders. To preach the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth, is our duty.

We recommend that our pastors urge the churches to do more for this great work. We urge our brethren to pray God's blessings upon it, and give of their means to its support.

I began my work as missionary in this Association September 1st, 1895, during which time I have preached about 112 sermons, made about 125 visits, made about 20 prayer-meeting talks. This work has been done at and about the following places, viz: Lea Bethel church, Bayne's School House, Smith's School House, Paylor's School House, Mountain Hill School House, Altamahaw Factory and Mr. Lunsford's Home. With the literature furnished by the American Baptist Publication Society and the Southern Series, and the cheapness of it, no one has the right to complain.

#### REPORT ON HOME MISSIONS.

Last Conventional year, ending April 30, 1895, the Board had 425 missionaries on the field. They baptized 5,921, an increase of 1,451

over the year previous.

This Board is doing its work among the Indians, the Negroes in the south, and along the coast meeting the large influx of foreign population that comes to our land.

Let us awake to the needs of this great work, and help at once the

#### REPORT ON EDUCATION.

In preparing and presenting this report on Education to the Beulah Association, we feel very confident in stating that our Baptist Institutions of learning are in a more hopeful condition than ever before in our history. Wake Forest College, the center of our denominational work, is in a prosperous condition; with her able faculty, the rise of three hundred students, splendidly equipped buildings, elegant literary societies, beauty of situation, and hosts of friends to encourage, so well presided over by the wise Dr. Charles E. Taylor, that the matriculation fees pay all the running expenses of the college, and several hundred dollars over, which amount is added to the endowment fund.

Oxford and Murfreesborough Female Seminaries are well patron-

ized and doing their best work in educating young women.

The much talked of and badly needed Baptist Female University is progressing well, and will soon open its doors to the hundreds of girls anxious to enter.

Bethel Hill Institute, which was adopted by the Beulah Association one year ago, will, with the beginning of this fall session, enter a splendid new building, and continue on a larger scale her great mission of imparting light.

The Biblical Recorder, with its two magnificent educational numbers, has given new impetus to the whole cause of education. With all this to encourage us, there is no reason for our youth growing up in ignorance.

Let Baptists be proud of and patronize their own institutions. We believe it to be the duty of our pastors to preach frequently on Christian Education, and thereby encourage all to educate as far as Respectfully submitted, possible.

#### REPORT ON MINISTERIAL RELIEF BOARD.

The Board has been in active operation five years. During this time there has been 21 beneficiaries, six of these brethren have died and two widows have married, leaving 13 on the list at present, whom the Board is trying to support as the churches enable us to do by their contributions. Three of these beneficiaries have been received since last Convention. Received since last Convention only \$174.64, but the Board hopes to have this amount greatly increased before the Convention meets again, and without it the Board will be utterly unable to afford to these aged servants of God the aid they are expecting and so much need.

Your committee asks that the work be given more prominence in our annual meetings, and one annual collection be taken for same.
