

CHRISMON SYMBOLS WORKSHOP:

A Chrismon workshop will be held on Monday, October 11 in the Mackie Hall Commons Room. Mrs. Marguerite Pascal will direct the making of several new symbols for the Stealey Hall tree. This Chrismon tree will again be located in the rotunda area during the Christmas season. You are invited to come and learn the art of making Chrismons.

FOR WOMEN IN SEMINARY: In recent days, the Library and the Student Activities Office have provided women dormitory residents a copy of A Resource for Women in Seminary. This publication is a rather extensive information resource on the ever expanding area of women in theological education. If you are a woman student, but did not receive a copy of the Resource Guide, you may request one through the Library or the Student Activities Office. Since these will have to be ordered from the publisher, please make your request by Friday, October 22.

PARKING NOTICES: The library construction project has required the use and control of all parking in the lot behind Lea Lab building on the north side of the campus. C.T. Wilson Construction Company has agreed to allow parking on the left side only (next to the building). Vehicles are not to be parked near the dumpster or on the grass next to the wall to the left of the entrance from North Avenue. Vehicles can be parked next to the trailer as long as the drive is not blocked. All vehicles parked in violation of specified regulations may be towed without warning at the owner's expense due to the requirements of the contractor and the need to maintain access to the campus for maintenance or postal vehicles.

RAPID READING CLASS: A six weeks course in Rapid Reading will be offered on the campus beginning on Tuesday, October 26. The non-credit course is designed to help the student improve his skills in reading by increasing speed and comprehension. The class will meet in Appleby 109 on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons from 4:00 until 6:00 p.m. and will conclude on December 3. The cost to the student is \$5.00, to be paid at the first meeting of the class. A minimum of fifteen students is required for the class to be offered, and not more than about twenty-five can be handled comfortably. If you are interested, please sign the sheet on the bulletin board in Appleby Hall. Signing is not a contract to enroll, but those who sign the sheet will have first call on places in the class.
