

MINUTES

The Antioch Primitive Baptist Association met with Bethel Church, Smithville, Ga., Sumter County, October 11-12, 1912, in the forty-second annual session, Elder P. S. Killen, Moderator, presiding and L. Jones, Clerk.

Friday Morning Session

Promptly at 10 o'clock prayer meeting began with Elder P. S. Killen, by singing Hymn 411. Prayer offered by Bro. M. Kaigler. Elder P. S. Killen then introduced Elder J. D. Lightfoot to the body, who had been appointed by the previous Association to preach the introductory sermon, who sang Hymn 533 and read the 125th Psalm of David; selected the 1-2 verses for his text and preached the introduction sermon with great power and demonstration. Elder G. W. Hopkins sang Hymn 214 and alternated the sermon. Elder P. S. Killen sang Hymn 76 and announced benediction.

Friday Evening Session

Strictly at 1:30 o'clock Elder P. S. Killen resumed his chair and sang Hymn 364; prayer offered by Elder A. Wooten of N. C., after which the moderator read the 5th chapter of the Gospel recorded by St. Matthew, for the body's consideration; then an-

nounced the house ready for business.

By motion of the body Elder P. S. Killen was re-elected moderator and L. Jones, clerk, and Bro. S. Adams, assistant clerk. Agreed by motion to invite visiting brethern to seat with the body. Motion and agreed to re-elect the finance committee, viz: J. W. Winn, E. M. Law and G. Roberts. By motion agreed to appoint a committee of 3 on arranging preaching from day to day. Also agreed to receive correspondence from sister association which is as follows: Received Elder A. Wooten from the Radecue Association of N. C. with a file of minutes whose next session will be held at the Galilee church, Edgecomb county, 5 miles east of the Rocky Mountain. Also received Elder H. Black from the Radecue Association; received Elder C. Loyd, from the Union Association; received Elder P. H. Hollis from the Mt. Calvary Association; received Elder P. H. Hollis from the Mount Ramah Association; received correspondence from Mt. Olive Association through Elder

P. S Killen. On motion agreed to receive the correspondence of the correspondence association. The Moderator gave all the corresponding delegates the right hand of fellowship in token of love. On motion agreed that the Moderator appoint all committees. By motion agreed to appoint a committee of 12 on ministerial and new church affairs. Also agreed to appoint a committee of 12 on union meetings. A committee of 7 were appointed on deceased ministers. Three reading secretaries were appointed to read church letters. On motion the time was extended 15 minutes longer than usual to finish up some important matters. By motion agreed to the report of committee on arranging preaching from day to day. A motion prevailed that Conference stand adjourned until Saturday morning 8 o'clock. Benediction by the Moderator.

Friday Evening Services

Began by Bro. G. M. Turner singing Hymn 141; prayer offered by Bro. A. Bateman. Elder T. Gresham sang Hymn 490 and the 5th chapter of Paul's Epistle to the Gallatins; beginning at the 1st verse and preached the 3 o'clock sermon. Elder A. F. Forest sang Hymn 413 and alternated. Elder P. S. Killen sang Hymn 272 and dismissed the congregation.

Friday Night Service

Began with Bro. G. M. Turner singing Hymn 41; prayer offered by Bro. A. Carter. Elder P. S. Killen introduced Elder G. Wiburn to the congregation, who sang Hymn 3 and read the 1st chapter of the Gospel Recorded by St. John; also read the 1st verse for a text and preached the 7 o'clock sermon. Elder W. M. Thomas sang Hymn 197 and alternated the sermon. Elder C. Loyd then sang Hym 300 and followed the same subject. Elder P. S. Killen concluded the services. Prayer offered by Bro. J. B. Baldwin. Benediction by Elder P. S. Killen.


