NOMINATIONS FOR FACULTY VACANCY: On January 26, 1978, the Faculty approved a statement of qualifications for the position in New Testament which was declared vacant by the President as a result of the death of Dr. Raymond Brown. The Dean will be collecting information about persons to be considered by the faculty for nomination to this post through February 20. Curriculum vitae would be helpful including current position and address. The following qualifications will apply to this vacancy: (1) A committed Christian of good character and reputation. (2) A person with an earned research doctrate in New Testament and a demonstrated competency in the field of specialization. (3) A Baptist interested in the Southern Baptist Convention and able to work harmoniously in the denominational setting. (4) A person who can relate to the churches of the denomination and help interpret to them the mission of the seminary. (5) A person able and willing to teach courses utilizing Greek as well as English texts.
