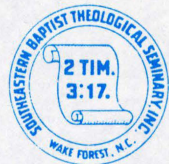
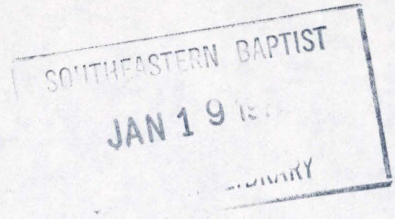

KEESEE DEADLINES:

The Charles B. Keesee Educational Fund is a private foundation which provides financial assistance for qualified students preparing for ministry in the Southern Baptist Convention. Although priority is given to residents of Virginia and N.C., qualified students from other states may also apply and receive aid. Two deadlines should be noted: To receive assistance for the summer terms, applications must be returned by March 1. For assistance in the fall and spring semesters, applications must be returned to the Keesee Fund by April 15. Information and addresses for Keesee applications may be received in the Student Affairs office, Mackie Hall.
