SEMINARY STUDENT PROGRAM: The Foreign Mission Board of the SBC has just begun a new program to provide

opportunities for service in overseas missions for qualified seminary students. Students desiring consideration must be enrolled in a Southern Baptist Seminary with a minimum of 12 hours completed. He must be age 29 or under; have an active membership in a Southern Baptist Church, and meet the physical, mental, moral and spiritual standards expected of anyone serving on the mission field. Applications and additional information may be obtained in the Director of Student Activities' office, Mackie Hall.

AFRC BULLETIN: The African Famine Relief Committee has placed a PLEDGE POSTER on the bulletin board in Appleby. The AFRC is asking each student and faculty member to pledge at least \$ 1.00 per month until May, 1975. This would mean that approximately \$700.00 would be given per month and \$1,900.00 by the end of the Spring compater. and \$4900.00 by the end of the Spring semester. All money is sent to the Baptist World Alliance and designated for African relief. The B.W.A. uses 100% of the money for relief itself since administrative costs are covered from other sources.
