

CORRESPONDING LETTER

The Bethel Primitive Baptist Association in our tenth session, to her sister associations with whom we correspond, sendeth greeting:

Dear Brethren in the Lord.— We have held another session of our body in sweet peace and unity. Your correspondents and visitors have come to us richly laden with the gospel of Christ for which we thank God.

While we are a young association, we have ever been satisfied with the old paths and have ever contended for salvation wholly by grace from start to finish and that in regeneration, the child of God is wholly passive, but in obedience, he, by enabling grace, is active. We as an association have ever opposed and condemned Arminianism, Universalism, Russellism, Morganism, non-resurrection of the body, predestination of sin and wickedness, and all kindred heresies, and our doors are closed against all who hold the above heresies.

We love and greatly appreciate our corresponding and visiting brethren and associations, and desire a continuation of your lovely correspondence.

Our next session will convene with Emmaus church, 4½ miles south of Carrollton, Ga., where we hope to be greeted again by your lovely correspondence.

ABSTRACT OF PRINCIPLES

1. We believe in only one true and living God, and that there are three that bear record in Heaven—the Father, the Word, and the Holy Ghost, and these three are one. (John 1:1; 1 John 5:7).

2. We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are the written word of God, and the only rule of faith and practice. (2 Peter 1:21; 2 Tim. 3:16).

3. We believe that God elected or chose his people in Christ before the foundation of the world, that they should be holy and without blame before Him in love. (Eph. 1:4, 5; 1 Peter 1:2; Rom. 8:29, 30; Psalm 68:4).

4. We believe the doctrine of original sin, and of man's impotency to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by nature, by his own free will and ability. (Rom. 5:12; John 6:44; Rom. 3:9-23).

5. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ. (Rom. 5:19; 1 Cor. 1:30; Rom. 3:24; 4:5; 7, 8, 24).

6. We believe that God's elect shall be effectually called, regenerated and sanctified by the Holy Spirit and shall be preserved in grace and never fall finally away. (2 Tim. 1:9; John 6:63; Rom. 8:29, 30; John 10:27-30; 1 John 3:9).

7. We believe that baptism, the Lord's Supper, and washing the saint's feet are ordinances of Jesus Christ, and that true believers are the only subjects of these ordinances and the true mode of baptism is immersion. (Mark 1:9; Rom. 6:4; Matt. 26, 27; John 13:5).

8. We believe in the resurrection of the dead or physical body and a general judgment and the punishment of the wicked will be everlasting and the joys of the righteous will be eternal. (John 5:28, 29; Matt. 2546; 1 Cor. 15:12-40).

9. We believe that no minister has the right to administer the ordinances only such as are called by God, as was Aaron and come under the imposition of the hands by a Presbytery and is in fellowship with the church of which he is a member. (Mark 3:14; 1 Tim. 4:14).

10. We believe that God has ordained good works, that His children should walk in them, and that good works are only such as God commanded in His word and not such as without the warrant thereof, are devised of men out of blind zeal, or any pretense of good intentions. (Matt. 28:19, 20; 2 Tim. 3:16; Eph. 2:10; Tit. 3:8).

11. It is and has been the sense of the churches composing the

Bethel Primitive Baptist Association not to hold in fellowship any church, member or minister who holds the following: boards, conventions, Missionary societies, Sunday schools, theological schools, Epworth leagues, instrumental music in the worship of God, a salaried ministery or assessing or taxing the members, Freemasonry, Odd Fellows, or other secret orders or religious societies that do now exist or may hereafter exist, founded upon the wisdom of men, together with any of the modern attempts to reform the church of God, or the heretical doctrines of sin being a fruit of God's decree or denying endless punishment for the wicked.

12. We hold it to be disorderly and a public offense against the church of God in the aggregate to receive members from a sister church on confession of faith, even if the church has error in it, until Gospel labor has been bestowed and the church has been scripturally withdrawn from. We further hold that it is gross disorder to receive an excluded member from a church until a church has been deposed or has gone out of existence. We hold it to be disorder for an association to usurp authority over her own churches, Associations and ministers of sister associations as dictators and regulators. We further hold that discipline belongs exclusively to the church and the church cannot transmit or delegate her authority to any man or set of men to discipline members or churches.



Brother W. T. Lee, member of Tallapoosa church, born Oct. 17, 1861, died April 9, 1925.




