SEMINARY LIBRARY

The Faculty Club met for the first time this Fall on October 12. The members gathered at the President's home for dinner and a report from Dr. Tom Bland and Dr. John Steely on their sabbatical leave activities last academic year. Dr. Elmo Scoggin is the Chairman of the Faculty Club 1978-79.

FACULTY CLUB

On October 23, a group of Southeastern Seminary representatives met with Rod Reinecke, consultant. This was the first phase of a consultation sponsored jointly by the Seminary and the Department of Pastoral Care, North Carolina Baptist Hospital, to review and to project areas of cooperation between the two schools. Several types of relationships have developed through the years. One goal of the consultation is to plan for future joint programs of study.

PASTORAL CARE CONSULTATION

The second phase of the consultation will be a retreat with representatives of the Department of Pastoral Care in early December.

The Lilly Foundation is sponsoring a study of theological education in the United States. The study has been underway for the past three years. One strategy of the study team is to visit various seminaries to review preliminary findings with faculty, administration, and trustees.

LILLY STUDY

Bob Lynn, Vice President of the Lilly Foundation, met with a representative group of Southeastern Seminary faculty, administration, and trustees on October 30. A variety of issues raised in the study were reviewed in detail.

Dr. Glenn Miller, Associate Professor of Church History at Southeastern, is the only Southern Baptist member of the study team.

On October 30, the Deans of the six SBC seminaries met in New Orleans to draft a document outlining for the Presidents a plan for cooperation between the seminaries in off-campus degree programs. Hopefully, once a document has been drawn, less competition will prevail between the schools and in the process off-campus degree programs will be enhanced.

SBC SEMINARY DEANS MEET

The working drawings for the 100 student apartments will be ready for bids in thirty days. Financing is in the final stages of arrangement (even though the economic activity of the past few days may have a dramatic effect on the final financing plan).

CAPITAL PROJECTS

The Juniper Street Subdivision will be bid along with the apartment site plan. This way the subdivision/apartment projects will be large enough to attract certain contractors for bids.
