

### MINUTES.

The sixty-eight annual session of the Harmony Primitive Baptist Association convened with Union church, Randolph county, Georgia Oct. 12, 13, 14, 1906.

The introductory sermon was preached by Elder J. N. Mathews of the Ocmulgee Association. Text 1st John, 1st chapter.

After an intermission of an hour the Association was called to order by our Moderator, Brother B. F. Markett. Prayer by Elder T. J. Head of Ochloconee Association.

Received and heard letters and statements from fourteen (14) churches, minuted their state, then went in choice of officers which resulted in the selection of Deacon B. F. Markett moderator, and R. H. Jennings clerk.

Called for petionary letters.

Invited visiting ministers and brethren to seats with us.

Appointed the following committee on preaching: W. S. Armor, R. F. Iver, J. W. F. Murray, J. R. Battle, J. L. Thompson.

On business: J. H. Brim, E. Nowell, and J. T. Davis.

To examine correspondence: Elder W. T. Everett, T. G. Webb, W. W. Childers.

To write correspondence letters: Brother T. L. Morton and J. B. Murray.

On finance: B. D. Jones, W. M. Hasty and E. C. Webb.

On memorial: Elder W. T. Everett and W. H. Cain.

Called the roll, omitted reading the Decorun, called for correspondence and received the following brethren from Upatoie Association: Elders J. M. Murray, D. F. Woodall and Brother J. R. Adams.

From Chocktawhatchee: Elders J. J. Bird, J. W. Pelham, D. H. Belham, B. P. Brooks, M. N. Lain.

From Eacheconnee minutes.

From Flint River: Elder E. S. Ward, Brothers I. S. Daniel, J. C. Kilebrew.

Heard petition from the Ochloconee Association, for correspondence by Elder T. J. Head, which was received and correspondence renewed.

Received as visitors: Elder John Trent, from Washington Association, Virginia.

Elder J. N. Mathews, from Ocmulgee Association.

Elder W. B. Morgan, from Beulah, of Alabama.

On motion adjourned for preaching services until 9 o'clock Saturday morning.

#### Saturday Morning.

Met according to adjournment. Prayer by Elder W. T. Everett of our Association. Appointed Union meeting as follows:

1st. Dr. (third choice) at Harmony church, Richland, Ga., beginning on Friday before the fourth Sunday in June, 1907.

2nd. Dr. (first choice) at Chickasawhatchee church, Dawson, Ga., beginning on Friday before the fifth Sunday in June, 1907.

3rd. Dr. (second choice) at Antioch church, Early county, Ga., beginning on Friday before the fifth Sunday in Septmber 1907.

Called for report of committee on business, recommended old minutes as a guide.

Renewed call for correspondence, called for report of committee to examine correspondence. The committee's report find nothing claiming the attention of the Association.

Return correspondence to sister Association.

To the Upatoie to convene with County Line church, Chattahoochee, county, seven miles north of Glenalter, beginning on Tuesday after first Sunday in September, 1907.

To Eacheconnee to convene with Salem church, Crawford county, Ga., three miles from Roberta, beginning on Friday before the third Sunday in September, 1907. Send minutes.

Agreed to have 600 minutes printed and mailing the same, the clerk to have the remainder for his services.

A vote of thanks is hereby extended to the members of Union church and to the hospitable people of Shellman for the kindness and hospitable way that our Association has been entertained.

Appointed the next session of the body to convene with Providence church, Sumter county, Ga., nine miles from Sumter, on Central railroad, and three miles from Plains, Ga., on S. A. L. railroad, beginning on Friday before the second Sunday in October, 1907, at 10:30 o'clock.

Heard the report of committee on memorial reports. No death of deacon or minister.

Read and adopted the correspondence letter.

Read the minutes and adjourned to time and place mentioned.
