

REGISTRATION

FIRST SESSION—Monday, June 2, 1958. Classes will meet four days each week, Tuesday through Friday, beginning Tuesday, June 3. Two courses may be taken. Four semester hours credit may be earned in four weeks.

SECOND SESSION—Monday, June 30, 1958. Classes will meet four days each week, Tuesday through Friday, beginning Tuesday, July 1. Two courses may be taken. Four semester hours credit may be earned in four weeks.

COSTS

Fees \$20.00 per session. Room \$12.50 per session. Meals, approximately \$2.20 per day. The cost of books and supplies will vary, depending upon the courses taken.

FACILITIES

A completely renovated campus. A new and modern cafeteria. A new air-conditioned library. Modern dormitory facilities recently equipped with new furniture. Rooms available for single men, single women, and couples.

RECREATION

Golf, Tennis, Swimming, Gymnasium. The town of Wake Forest operates a modern swimming pool. A private nine-hole golf course within walking distance of the campus will be available for a modest fee. The Seminary gymnasium will be open. Excellent tennis courts are also available.

APPLICATIONS

Students entering Southeastern for the first time must make application fifteen days prior to the opening of the session.

Students planning to enter Southeastern for the first time in the first session should submit their applications not later than May 17, 1958. Historical and doctrinal examination of original sources, carried on in view of contemporary study.
