RAPID READING CLASS:

A six weeks course in Rapid Reading will be offered on the campus beginning on Tuesday, October 26. The non-credit course is designed to help the student improve his skills in reading by increasing speed and comprehension. The class will meet in Appleby 109 on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons from 4:00 until 6:00 p.m. and will conclude on December 3. The cost to the student is \$5.00, to be paid at the first meeting of the class. A minimum of fifteen students is required for the class to be offered, and not more than about twenty-five can be handled comfortably.
