August 1. O. L. Cross will assume part-time duties as Director of Housing. Evelyn Ward will become Housing Secretary. The Housing Office will be located on the second floor of Mackie Hall. Procedures are being established which should streamline assignment, inspection, regulation, and maintenance of all seminary housing. The addition of the 100 new townhouses increases the total number of seminary housing units (exclusive of dormitories) to more than 250.

The annual meeting of the Southern Baptist Convention in St. Louis,

June 10-12, resulted in the following actions having direct reference to Southeastern Seminary:

1. Adoption of a \$90,000,000 Cooperative Program Operating Budget for 1980-81. Southeastern will receive \$2,549,205 plus a portion of Phase 2 of the challenge budget.
2. Adoption of the 1980-81 Capital Needs Budget which allocates \$582,444 to Southeastern for Faculty offices.
3. Election of six trustees: John E. Roberts (MD), Henry T. Finch (SC), W. E. Speed (Northwest), Bill Bruster (TN), John Hicks (NC), and Jesse P. Chapman (NC).
4. Adoption of Resolutions on "Doctrinal Integrity" and "On Giving To Mission Causes."
