

DISTRIBUTION OF MINUTES TO SISTER ASSOCIATIONS

COMMUNION MEETINGS

We wish to extend to all our churches and to the peaceloving Baptists of our faith and order an invitation to commune with us at the following churches and dates:

Beaver Creek-4th Saturday and Sunday in May Senter-2nd Saturday and Sunday in June Riverview-3rd Saturday and Sunday in June Horse Creek-4th Saturday and Sunday in June North Fork-1st Saturday and Sunday in July Big Helton-3rd Saturday and Sunday in July Roans Creek-4th Saturday and Sunday in July

RULES OF DECORUM

- 1. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
- 2. A Moderator and Clerk shall be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.
- 3. Only one person shall speak at a time, who shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator when he is about to make his speech.
- 4. The person thus speaking shall not be interupted in his speech by anyone except the Moderator till he is done speaking.
- 5. He shall strictly adhere to the subject, and in no way reflect on the person who spoke before, so as to make remarks on his slips, failing or imperfection, but shall fairly state the matter as nearly as he can so as to convey his light or ideas.
- 6. No person shall abruptly break off or absent himself from the Association without liberty obtained from it.
- 7. No person shall rise and speak more than three times on one subject without liberty obtained from the Association.
- 8. No member of the Associations shall have liberty of laughing during the sitting of the same, nor whispering in the time of public speech.
- 9. No member of the Association shall address another in any other appellation than the title of brother.
- 10. The Moderator shall not interrupt any member or prohibit him from speaking till he give his light on the subject except he break the Rules of this Decorum.

- 13. The minutes of the Association shall be read, corrected, if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the Association rises.
- 14. Amendments to their plan or form of government may be made at any time by a majority of the Association, when they may deem it necessary, by giving the churches twelve months' notice.
- 15. The Association shall have power to provide for the general union of churches, to endeavor to preserve a chain of communion among the churches, to give the church the necessary advice in matters of difficulty.
- 16. To inquire into the cause, if any church fails to represent themselves at any time in the Association.
- 17. To appropriate those monies contributed by the churches to any purpose they may think proper.
- 18. The Association shall have power to withdraw from any church in the union which shall violate the rules of this Convention deviate from the orthodox principles of the gospel.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. We believe in one only true and living God, Father, Son and Holy Ghost and these three are One.
- 2. We believe that scriptures of the Old and New Testament as translated in the 1611 King James version of the Holy Bible, is the written work of God and the only rule of faith and practice.
 - 3. We believe in the doctrine of election by grace.

- 4. We believe in the doctrine of original sin and in Man's impotency to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by nature by his own free will or ability.
- 5. We believe that sinners are called, converted, regenerated and sancitifed by the Holy Spirit, and that all who are thus regenerated and born again by the Spirit of God shall never fall finally away.
- 6. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ.
- 7. We believe that baptism and the Lord's Supper are ordinances of Jesus Christ and that true believers are the only subjects of those ordinances and we believe the only true mode of baptism is by immersion.
- 8. We believe in the resurrection of the dead and a general judgment and the joys of the righteous and that the punishment of the sicked will be eternal.
- 9. We believe that no minister has the right to administer the ordinances of the gospel except such as are regularly called, and come under the imposition of hands by the presbytery.

CHURCH DIRECTORY

HORSE CREEK-Sunday (only), 11 a.m., following the fourth Saturday. A white, wood frame building about four miles northwest of Lansing, NC. Take Hwy. 194 from West Jefferson, NC, to Lansing, NC. From Lansing, go 1353 around one mile; turn left on 1324; follow 1324 to Joe Hampton Road; follow to end of pavement; turn left to church.

NORTH FORK-Sunday (only), 2 p.m., following the first Saturday. A white asbestos shingle church building located about three miles west of Warrensville, NC. Located between Warrensville NC, and Trade, TN. Take Hwy. 88 out of Warrensville, NC. About one mile, you will come to the North Fork of New River. Take first right-hand road. The church is about two miles on the right side of the road.

RIVERVIEW-The third Sunday following the third Saturday. A brick church building located about eight miles from West Jefferson, NC. Take Hwy. 221 about one mile and a half toward Boone, NC. Turn left on state road no. 1147. Go about six miles. The church is on the left side of the road.

ROANS CREEK-Fourth Saturday, 2:00 p.m., and Sunday, 11:00 a.m. A brick church building located between Jefferson, NC, and Laurel Springs, NC. Take Hwy. 88 out of Jefferson, NC, about seven miles. The church is on the left side of the road.

SENTER-Second Saturday, 11 a.m., and Sunday, 2 p.m. A brick church building located between Jefferson, NC, and Sparta, NC. Take Hwy. 221 out of Jefferson, NC, about eight miles near Nathan's Creek School.
