FRANK STAGG



A native of Louisiana, the 1980 Lecturer is Senior Professor of New Testament Studies at Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Louisville, Kentucky. From 1945 to 1964, Dr. Stagg was Professor of New Testament and Greek at New Orleans Theological Seminary. In 1964, he joined the faculty of Southern Seminary as

James Buchanan Harrison Professor of New Testament, which post he held until 1977.

Professor Stagg is a graduate of Louisiana College and holds the Th.M., and Ph.D. degrees from Southern. In 1955, Louisiana College awarded him the LL.D. degree. He has also done advanced study at Union Seminary, the University of Edinburgh, University of Basel and the University of Tuebingen.

Our guest lecturer has written extensively in scholarly publications. He is also the author of numerous books, among which are Exploring the New Testament (1961), New Testament Theology (1962), Studies in Luke's Gospel (1967). He is also the co-author, with his wife, of Woman in the World of Jesus, and he wrote the commentaries on "Matthew" and "Phillippians" for The Broadman Bible Commentary.
