The Church of course reserves the right to alter or amend the foregoing summary of the duties of the Board Trustees or to revoke the order by which the Board is constituted if thought at any time advisable by them so to do; and to fill all vacancies in the Board caused by death or otherwise.

Under the foregoing regulations Brothers Wm. A. B. Smith, Thos. Tosey, and Thos. J. Simpson, are appointed the members of the Board of Trustees.

The Board of Trustees met Thursday June 17th 1875. at Occoquan Meetinghouse for the purpose of making arrangements for finishing it.

After the meeting was organized we proceeded to business and appointed Brother Thomas Tasey as moderator and W. A. B. Smith Clerk after which we proceeded as follows

1st To sell the Lumber left over Building the House to T. J. Simpson at one Dollar per Hundred which amounted to one Dollar and thirty cents

2nd Brother T. J. Simpson was then appointed to take charge of the House to Open and Close for the Meetings, which he willingly accepted

3rd Then some proposals was made to finish the inside of the House but nothing final was agreed to

Thursday July 20th 1875

The Board met the following propositions in connection with finishing the Meeting House was adopted that the Board report at the next regular meeting of the Church suggesting to them the propriety of arranging with Brother Smith, engaging him to furnish plank for ceiling over head and up the sides as far as the Windows also for one Door to be made on the South side of the House and the Windows to be faced up inside and A. J. Carter be engaged to do the work at Dollars and the work to be done in good Workman manner.

At a meeting of members of the Old School Baptist Church living in the village of Occoquan, Va, held during the fall of 1852, the subject of buying a lot and building a meeting house for the use of the Old School Baptist was, we hope, prayerfully discussed. With an earnest desire that the God of heaven might guide us in this great work, and that it might not be undertaken unless in accordance with his will, it was thought well to move in this matter and to follow as the Lord might open the way, with we trust, an earnest desire and prayer that He might guide and that whatever was done might be with an eye single to his glory and the advancement of his cause. The house has been built with the distinct understanding that it is to be the exclusive property of the Old School Baptist, and to be entirely under their disposition and control. We recognize the fact that between us and the religious systems of this sin polluted world there is an impassable gulf, there can ^{not} be the slightest concord between the sons of darkness and the sons of the living light. The work has progressed under the supervision of the brethren living in the village, and the house and ground is to be under the disposition and control of the Occoquan Old School Baptist Church.
