- Painted and/or assisted in moving offices for seven faculty members in Stealey Hall.

- 3. Built a temporary ramp to the entrance of the Cafeteria.
- 4. Constructed offices in Mackie Hall for Foreign Mission Board personnel.

- 7. Remodeling of the Music Department in Binkley Chapel to be completed in September.

- 11. Roof repairs at the Manor, Mackie Hall, Cafeteria, and Bostwick.
- 12. Downspout repairs at the Gym, Bostwick, Stealey Hall, Binkley Chapel (emergency repairs only complete project pending).
- Safety rail made and installed at Lea Lab basement steps.
- 14. Repair to Plant Services driveway.
- 15. Installation of a sump pump and major repairs to the Stealey Hall elevator controls.
- 16. Replacement of compressor for Mackie Hall air conditioner unit.
- 17. Set up temporary housing in four locations.
- 18. Installed duct work vent in Xerox room.
- 19. Installed an additional eighteen benches on campus.
