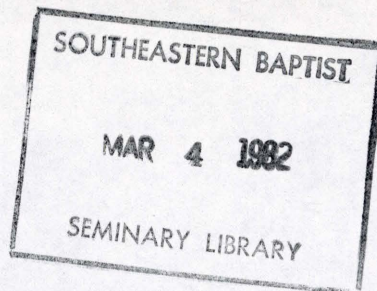

BLACK HISTORY MONTH PRESENTATION: In observance of Black History Month (February), the Southeastern Black Theological Forum will present an educational series on Black History, Friday, February 26, 1982 in the Library auditorium - second floor. Films will be shown between 8:00 and 10:00 a.m. The series will conclude with a major speaker and dialogue from 10:00 - 11:00 a.m. Guest speaker will be Dr. John W. Fleming, who is currently Director of Church Relations at Shaw University and Professor of Black Church Studies at Shaw Divinity School. A graduate of Shaw University, Oberlin College and Vanderbilt Divinity School, Dr. Fleming has taught at Shaw for 18 years and for 6 years he has been an adjunct professor at Southeastern. Everyone is invited to attend.
