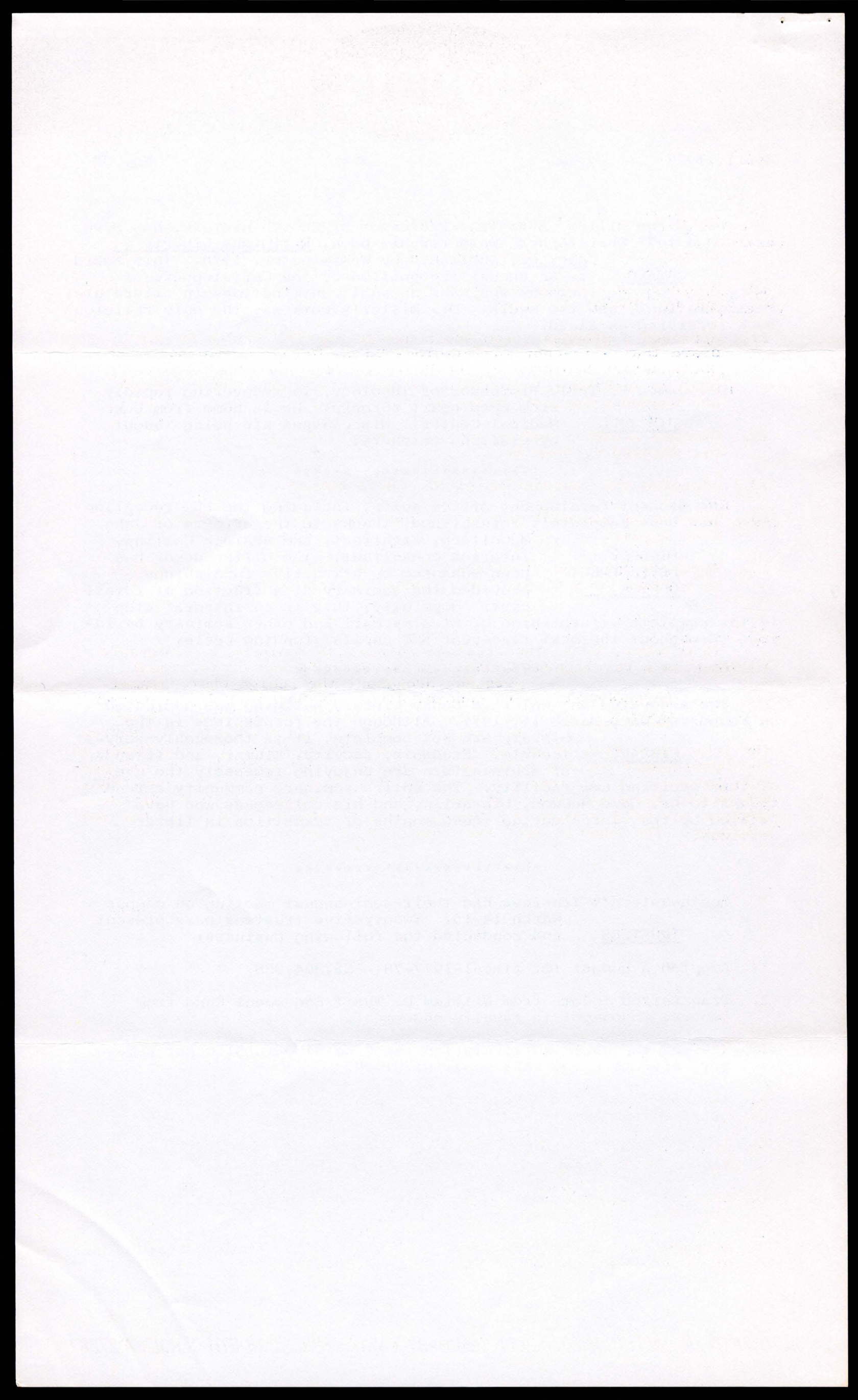

Southeastern's Trustees had their semi-annual meeting on campus March 14-15. Twenty-five trustees were present and conducted the following business:

TRUSTEES

1. Adopted a budget for fiscal 1977-78 - \$2,394,288
2. Transferred income from William L. Wyatt Endowment Fund from general endowment to faculty endowment.
3. Revised the basic matriculation fee from \$100 to \$150 per semester, effective the fall semester, 1978.
4. Adopted a plan for the seminary to award from time to time a Citation for Excellence in Ministry.
5. Gift, \$1,000 to Paschal Golf Club in light of: capital improvement at Club House and severe winter weather.
6. Accepted the enlarged and renovated Denny Library Building from the architect and general contractor.
7. Amended the seminary By-Laws to provide for a standing Board of Trustees Committee on Student Development.







8. Established the Roy S. Liner Memorial Scholarship Fund.
9. Established the William Carr Roberts Memorial Scholarship Fund.
10. Approved sabbatical leaves during 1977-78 for Dr. John E. Steely and Dr. Thomas A. Bland.
11. Approved a proposal from the Southern Baptist Sunday School Board that a teacher in Religious Education be funded at Southeastern Seminary by the Board in order to enhance cooperative working relationships between the Sunday School Board and Southern Baptist seminaries.
12. Granted academic tenure to Dr. George W. Braswell and Dr. Richard A. Spencer.
13. Accepted the resignation of Dr. Colin Harris.
14. Granted an easement across seminary property to the Town of Wake Forest.
15. Approved the request of the Town of Wake Forest for annexation of a tract of seminary land bordering highway #98 to U. S. 1.

In October, 1976, the Trustees authorized Southeastern Seminary to organize a Development Council of 30 business and professional persons throughout the region where alumni are concentrated. By March, 1977, seventeen of these persons had been enlisted. They met with the plenary planning group to review the long range Plan of Action of the seminary on March 15. On March 16 the Development Council held their organizational meeting with all members present. C. C. Hope, Jr., Charlotte, N. C. was elected chairman. Bob Marsh, Richmond, Va., was elected vice-chairman. Preliminary discussion was held regarding a broader base of financial support for the seminary. The Council will meet again in October.
