A record-setting 193 persons graduated during Spring Commencement exercises May 14-15. Dr. Cecil Ray, General Secretary-Treasurer of the Baptist State Con-GRADUATION vention of North Carolina, preached the commence-ment sermon. Dr. Garland Hendricks delivered 1976

the charge to the graduates. The President's reception for seniors and their families, the Senior Dinner and the Alumni Breakfast also marked the festivities.

This year's graduating class brings the total alumni to 3,124.

An additional gift of \$15,000 has been received in the Holy Land Study Fund. This brings the corpus to \$25,000. The purpose of the fund is to provide selected HOLY LAND

students with stipends for study in the land of biblical backgrounds. The first stipend is scheduled to be awarded in the Spring of 1977.

The library construction project is progressing rapidly. The addition is completely under roof and finish work is well underway. However, it is not expected that the new space LIBRARY will be available for the fall semester. PROJECT

The project was marred by tragedy on May 13. Archie C. Wimbley, 48, an employee of the general contractor, C. T. Wilson Company, fell 35 feet from a scaffold and died shortly after reaching the Wake Memorial Hospital. Preliminary reports indicate that he suffered a heart attack either before or after the fall.

He was a native of Garner, N. C. and had been employed by C. T. Wilson only ten days. Funeral services were conducted May 16 in Raleigh. President Lolley assisted in the memorial service. Wimbley had six children - all married.

Further memorial services are planned at the Seminary during the fall convocation. 1976.
