AEROBICS CONDITIONING FOR WOMEN:

Through a special arrangement with The Fitness Center of Cary (Jane Llewellyn, owner) the seminary will be offering two classes in body conditioning through aerobics for women (seminary students, staff, student and staff wives). Two, one hour sessions will be offered on Mondays and Thursdays between 5-7 p.m. in the gym. All classes are closed sessions with a maximum of 35 per class.
