PARKING NOTICE: Earlier in the semester it was stated that the C.T. Wilson Construction Company had agreed to allow

Seminary parking on the left side only of the Lea Lab lot as a vehicle entered from the street. However, we are still having serious difficulty in gaining access to the campus for repairs and mail delivery to the library; the dumpster is frequently blocked, preventing trash collection, and we have not honored the contractor's need for a clear driveway and the right side parking spaces. The delivery of furniture and equipment to the Library is scheduled from November 15-December and this area <u>must</u> be clear at all times for large vehicles. In order to accomplish this, the following will apply immediately: 1. A barricade has been placed to the left of the entrance to protect

- required access to the campus. Any vehicle blocking this area when needed by maintenance or the Post Office will be towed at owner's expense.
- 2. Any vehicle parked in the area of the dumpster will be towed at owner's expense.
- 3. Any vehicle parked on the right side between the hours of 7:30a.m. and 5:00p.m. will be ticketed for parking in a restricted area; vehicles will be towed at owner's expense whenever necessary to free space for the contractors or delivery of materials and equipment.
- 4. Any vehicle driven and/or parked on walks and grounds is in violation of regulations and may be ticketed or towed at owner's expense.
