PROCECEDINGS

Saturday Morning, July 31st, 1920

The introductory sermon was preached by Elder c. F. Denny from Romans 5:12, "Wherefore as by one man sin entered into the world, &c."

Closed by Elder T. C. Hart from no special text.

1st. After an intermission of one and one-half hours the messengers from the several churches met in the meeting house where the Association was opened with praise and prayer by Elder John McConnell from the Warwick Association of New York.

14th. As no brother from this Association has taken appointments to several of the Associations with whom we correspond, and being anxious that we be represented by some personal representative, we hereby authorize and instruct Elders J. E. Adams and L. H. Hardy to say to the Associations with whom we correspond, when no messenger or visitor of this Association is present, that we appreciate their correspondence and messengers who have come to see us, and that we desire a continuation of the same.

15th. Elders J. J. Hall and C. L. Wood were chosen to attend a section meeting to be held with the Church at Tar River, Granville county, North Carolina, on third Sunday and Saturday before, in April, 1921, and Elders J. A. Herndon and E. C. Oakes were chosen to attend another section meeting to be held with the Church at Flat River, Person county, North Carolina, on the Fourth Sunday and Saturday before, in April, 1921. 16th. Brother M. G. Markham was chosen to write circular letter to be read at our next annual session.

17th. Agreed that our next annual session be held with the Church at Mount Zion, Halifax county, Virginia, commencing on Saturday before the first Sunday in August, 1921, and to continue three days. Elder J. J. Hall was chosen to preach the introductory sermon and Elder E. C. Oakes alternate.

18th. Ordered that our Clerk have printed by the P. D. Gold Publishing Co., of Wilson, N. C., one thousand of these minutes and distributed with the Churches and Associations with whom we corres-*pond.

19th. Feeling that we have been wonderfully blessed and favored by the presence of such able and gifted ministers of Christ who have met with us from several different states, all preaching the same glorious doctrine of Salvation by Grace, without any discordant nete. Therefore, be it resolved:

First: That we return thanks to God for this and all other unmerited blessings.

Second: That we extend to the brethren, sisters and friends of this church and neighborhood our heartfelt thanks and appreciations for their many acts of kindness and generous hospitality, in helping us entertain this Association, especially to W. L. Carrin, manager of the Delco Light Co., of Oxford, N. C., for furnishing lights; also to E. D. Hunt, sheriff of this county and his deputies for their presence and in helping us maintain order, which has been all that we could expect with such a large crowd.

Third: That this Association discountenances and forbids any and all kinds of trading and trafficking and any other misbehavior on or near the Church grounds, when and where same is being held and will endeavor to punish such, by special act of the General Assembly of North Carolina.

The above proceedings were read by the clerk, after which we adjourned to meet again at the time and place appointed for our next annual session.

MEMORIAL, UNANIMOUSLY ADOPTED

Whereas, it hath pleased the Master to call up higher our dearly beloved Father in Israel Elder P. D. Gold of the Black Creek Association, who first attended the Country Line Association at Camp Creek in August 1870, (only a few months after uniting with the Church), and who for firty years, with but two exceptions has been present at its sessions. During all this time his deportment and preaching has met the hearty approval and endorsement of every Church and member of this Association.

Therefore be it resolved :---

First, That we desire to bow in humble submission to the stroke which removes from us one of our most beloved minister. One who tood firm, and failed not to "preach the word; be instant in season, and out of season; reprove and rebuke, exhort with all long suffering and doctrine" ((II. Tim. 4:2); who was blessed with a meek and quiet spirit and spoke the truth in love. A man favored of God and worthy of double honor, in that he followed peace with all men, and labored faithfully in word and doctrine, and to do good to all men, especially unit them who "are of the house-hold of faith", whose ministration of comfort was not conined to public service only, but in a great measure given to the aged and afflicted. One who was an honored and welcome guest, having visited the home of most of the members of this Association.

Second. As he was enabled through Grace to spend the greater part of his life in such patient, faithful, acceptable and loving service to the brethren and Churches, contending for the simplicity of the Gospel, unmixed with man's efforts, and considering him endowed above ordinary measure with the Graces of the Spirit.

Now therefore be it further resolved,

That we desire to render thanks to God for the gracious manifestation of his spirit expressed in the life of our dear brother "a sinner saved by grace" which caused him to live to the praise and honor of Jesus' name, and that we endeavor to emulate his Godly walk and conversation, striving first of all for the things of the Kingdom. Third. We sorrow because we shall see his dear face no

Third. We sorrow because we shall see his dear face no more, yet we rejoice that he fought a good fight, kept the faith and is entered into his rest, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, shall give, not to him only, but to all them that love his appearing.

Therefore be it further resolved:

That we the members and messengers of the Lower Country Line Association now in conference with the Church at Dutchville, Granville County, North Carolina. do adopt the foregoing memorial, and order, that a copy be spread upon the minutes of this Association, a copy sent to the bereaved family, and a copy published in Zion's Landmark. Unanimously adopted by a rising vote. July 31, 1920.

CIRCULAR LETTER

To the Churches composing the Lower Country Line Association: Dear Brethren in Christ:

Again the Lord has permitted us to meet in the capacity of an association where we may sing together and relate our experiences of brotherly love for the many blessings that we have received since we last met.

Having been appointed by you to write a circular letter, I shall now make the attempt.

Brethren, I feel that you have made a mistake in calling on such a worm as I for I don't feel that I can write much that will be to the comfort and edification of your soul. In thinking over a subject, the sweetest passage of scripture to my soul and the one at all times most dear to me, came to mind: "There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the spirit." Erethren, one of the happiest moments of my life was when I felt that this passage of scripture applied to me, and now, when I pick up by Bible I feel that I must read the eighth chapter of Romans before I stop. It seems that it means more to me than any other chapter in the Bible. Never before could I feel as sure that I was a christian, although I had been a church member for ten years. Since that time I have had more liberty in prayer, because I feel that I am free from the law of sin and death. Yet, there are two forces at work in us which to the natural man are confusing; he cannot understand them, because he has not been changed from nature to grace. It is a wheel within a wheel, each working in the same time. When we would do good evil is present, but here is our hope-"It is no more I that do it, but sin that dwelleth in me". So we see that what the law could not do, in that it was weak. the Merciful God has done for us. Now, here comes the devil and says that this thought or feeling is only a state of mind, and that our religion is due to our environment, for it is said "The mind is its self and in its self can make a heaven of hell or a hell of heaven". Brethren, is it possible that we can be deceived in this all important matter? God forbid, for tis He who works in us both to will and to do of His own good pleasure, and He gives us the mind to worship Him in spirit and in truth. If it were a matter of the mind and environment, then it would be up to the creature and he would be a free agent. I pity the man who worships his God because his mind tells him it is the proper thing to do. If we have the love of God in our hearts, and have tasted of the riches of His love we will be able to give a reason of the hope that dwells within us, "For I am persuaded that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.
