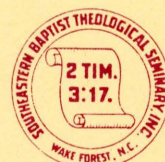
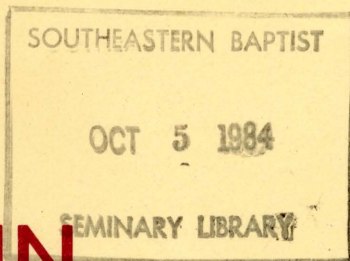

KEESEE FUND
CLARIFICATION:

Please note the following clarification of current Keesee Fund policies. (1) Students preparing for ministries with Southern Baptists, who were residents of VA or NC prior to entering SEBTS and who are enrolled full time (10 hours - Master Program, 12 hours - Associate Program) will be eligible for full amount from Keesee designated for the student by Keesee for that semester. (2) Students enrolled for at least 6 hours but not fulltime are eligible for one-half of full amount designated for the student for that semester. (3) Students enrolled for less than 6 hours are not eligible for a grant from the Keesee Fund.
