1841. March 27<sup>th</sup> A number of Baptist brethren  
living in the neighbourhood of Beaverkill and  
belonging to the first Baptist Church of Christ in  
the town of Olive, requested to be dismissed from  
that Church for the purpose of being formed in  
a Baptist Church of the same faith and order  
and the Church voted that all those Brethren  
and Sisters that wanted letters of dismission for  
the purpose of being constituted in regular Baptist  
Church should have them when ever requested  
April 24<sup>th</sup> 1841. The following Brethren and Sisters -  
requested letters of dismission from the Church for  
the purpose above stated. Brethren Cornelius J  
Jones, Conrad J Elmendorf, Cornelius C Philips,

Church as leader of our party

On the second Friday in February 1889  
many hours

The Aster, Flax, Fucus, Bromelia, Seaner  
Cleistesi, and Datura found abundantly at the Neuquén  
Chilean coast south and eastward the  
coastal community. & in our days now living near the cell  
The Church grew and flourished far

On the cessation of the English civil war  
members of the Puritan Church were  
tried in the Locality Courts which were  
to be established in a locality by a church  
or a churchman. The trial was to be  
conducted according to Canon law and a  
held for the purpose which was to be  
within defined boundaries. Their numbers  
would then be sufficient to form a  
Court of Justice.

The Church was consecrated on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of August 1843, during the month of Bountiful  
Baptist Church which name has been kept  
in succeeding generations to the present time.

In the village of Duxford as well as in all  
the Cambridgeshire villages there was a  
house which was erected in the year of 1792 by  
the Church and Congregation of the Quakers  
but who were holding meetings for public  
worship in that Houghton Hall.

The Breezefield Gothic Church and  
the Woolring house.

On the 13<sup>th</sup> day of September <sup>1791</sup> the Church voted to join the Warwick <sup>Association</sup> and appointed Elder Lathrop, Isaac Finch, John Tinton and Joseph Webb as messengers.

In 1797 Elder John Caton came to preach for the Church and served till the seventh of March 1807 when he was granted a letter of dismission.

On the 21<sup>st</sup> of April 1808 Elder Henry Ball was ordained by the Church to preach the Gospel.

Elder Ball served the Church as Pastor till the seventh of May 1831 when the Church granted him a letter of dismission.

At this period the great division in the Baptist denomination took place.

The Brookfield Church remained true to the old doctrine and Articles of Faith as set forth in the covenant of their Constitution in 1783.

In June <sup>1832</sup> Elder Gabriel <sup>Cooklin</sup> became Pastor of the Brookfield Church, and served it till September 5<sup>th</sup> 1846 when he was granted a letter of dismission.

In April 1847 they called Elder Benjamin Pether who took to the Pastorate care of the church and who served as Pastor for five years, succeeded by Elder Daniel Harding, who preached two years, followed by Elder Slater for about two years.

For the next ten years the Church rapidly declined. Members took letters to other Churches. Those who remained steadfast and filled up their places as was their duty through this trying period had the satisfaction of again having started preaching for seven years, being

supplied by the late William L. Benedict  
of Warwick who <sup>afterward</sup> left the church for three years.  
During this period the church had had only  
visits from brethren who occasionally came  
and cheered up the little flock.

In July 1898 Elder John McConnell came  
and acceptably supplied the church statedly till  
the appointment was taken up for the winter season  
of 1901-2.

At one period in the history of the church it  
numbered one hundred and ninety members.  
Upwards of an hundred members have  
been dismissed to constitute other churches,  
all of which have died out while the old  
Brookfield Church with now but seven  
members remain.

## The old Meetinghouse.

The Church was constituted nine years before it had a place of its own in which to worship.

In 1792 having procured a piece of land for that purpose the church and congregation, the edifice which has been in use ever since.

This old Meetinghouse has of late years become an object of much interest.

Many people visit it yearly to behold the last remaining church building left intact that was constructed by English Carpenters more than a century ago.

In looking it over the mind of the beholder is carried back to a period when people went to meeting ~~to~~ only to worship.

In that long ago period the now empty and silent pews were filled every meeting day before time for service to begin.

Of all that vast throng that were wont to assemble here and make the walls of the old house resound with their songs of praise, not one remains.

All gone, gone: Only the old house stands a silent witness of the past.

I would appreciate any help you can give me. I will gladly pay for any xeroxing involved. Thank you very much for your time and help.


