He has had two books published by our Broadman Press: "Life's <u>Everyday Questions</u>" (1953) and "<u>Preaching from Ecclesiastes</u>" (1958). He bas written for many of our Southern Baptist periodicals and contributes a regular column to the La.State Baptist Paper entitled, "Thus saith the Preacher".

Prior to coming to the St. Charles Avenue Baptist Church in September, 1961, he served as Pastor of the First Baptist Church, Ruston, La. from 1948-1961. He has also served pastorates in Champaign, Ill. and Baton Rouge, La.

Dr. Lee is a native of Oklahoma. He received the B. A. degree from Hardin-Simmons University, Texas; the B. D. degree from Yale University and the Doctor of Literature degree (honorary) from Hardin-Simmons University in 1958.

Our speaker has participated in ten University preaching missions in the United States as well as several preaching missions overseas in Europe, the Middle East and Australia - traveling in 32 different countries.

He has served on the Christian Life Commission of the Southern Baptist Convention (1956-62) and was its Chairman, 1960-61. Presently he is the President of the Greater New Orleans Federation of Churches.

Your pastor has known Avery Lee for years and has served with him in a revival meeting in Ruston, La. I've long admired him as an able preacher and an intelligent, yet warm-hearted man of God. His messages are timely yet biblically-based. He is "at home" on any campus yet avoids the "stuffiness" that sometimes plagues university preachers!
