

SEVENTY-FIFTH ANNUAL SESSION

ECHECONNEE ASSOCIATION OF PRIMITIVE BAPTISTS

...HELD WITH ...

RAMAH CHURCH, MONROE COUNTY, GA.,

SEPTEMBER 18th, 19th and 20th, 1903.

1st. The Introductory Sermon was delivered by Eld. R. H. Jennings, of the Harmony Association. Text, 2nd Timothy, 2nd chap., 19th verse.

After prayer by Eld. S. T. Bently, of the body, the Association proceeded to business.

2d. Called for the letters sent up by the churches, which were read and the names of messengers enrolled.

3d. Proceeded to elect a Moderator and Clerk, which, upon motion, was done by acclamation, and resulted in the election of Eld. W. C. Cleveland, Moderator, and H. E. Murray, Clerk.

4th. Appointed Committees as follows:

On Preaching—T. M. Haygood, J. W. Fielder, J. D. McGee, N. T. Dumas and A. G. Horne.

On Contributions and to Distribute Corresponding Minutes—Eld. A. A. Garrett, W. C. Lewis and W. H. Smith.

To write a Corresponding Letter-Eld. W. W. Childs.

5th. Invited visiting brethren to seats with us.

6th. Called for Correspondence from Sister Associations and received—

From the Upatoie—Elds. D. F. Woodall, W. W. Riner, and Bros. L. B. Anderson, J. C. Pye and H. A. Childs.

From the Marietta Old School-No messenger or minutes.

From the Primitive Western—Elds. B. C. Caldwell, G. W. Rowe, and Bros. H. F. Willis and J. G. Brown.

From the Harmony-Eld. R. H. Jennings, with minutes.

From the Ebenezer—Eld. J. A. Taylor and Licentiate J. T. McArthur. From the Pulaski—Minutes.

Suspended the order of business to receive visitors from Sister Associations and churches with whom we are not in regular correspondence, and received Eld. T. E. Sikes, from the New Beulah Association, and Eld. J. F. Almand, from the Yellow River Association; Eld. D. G. McCowan, from the Ocmulgee, and Bro. J. W. Bostick from the same.

7th. Resumed the regular order of business, and called for Petitionary Letters.

Prayer by Eld. W. W. Childs, of the body. Adjourned to 9 o'clock to-morrow morning.

SATURDAY MORNING, Sept. 19th, 1903.

The Association met pursuant to adjournment. Prayer by Eld. A. A. Garrett, of the body.

1st. Called the roll, and dispensed with having the Decorum read.

2d. Called for further correspondence from Sister Associations, and received Bro. Columbus Haygood, from the Salem Association, of Texas.

3d. Renewed the invitation to visiting brethren to seats with us.

4th. Returned correspondence to Sister Associations:

To the Upatoie, to convene with the church at Mount Nebo, Taylor county, Ga., commencing on Tuesday after the first Sunday in September, 1904—Elds. A. A. Garrett, Morgan Brown, S. T. Bently, and Bros. H. J. Brown, J. S. McGee and M. H. McElmurray.

To the Primitive Western, to convene with Emmaus Church, Troup county, Ga., commencing on Tuesday after the first Sunday in October, 1903—Eld. Morgan Brown.

To the Harmony, to convene with the church at Pataula, Quitman county, Ga., commencing on Friday before the second Sunday in October, 1903—Elds. A. A. Garrett, S. T. Bently, Morgan Brown and Bro. B. F. Williamson.

To the Primitive Pulaski, to convene with the church at Valley Grove, Irwin county, Ga., commencing on Friday before the first Sunday in October, 1903—Eld. J. T. Reynolds and Bro. J. M. Fredrick.

To the Primitive Ebenezer, to convene with Camp Creek Church, Baldwin county, Ga., commencing on Friday before the fourth Sunday in

September, 1903—Elds. J. T. Reynolds, A. A. Garrett and Bro. B. F. Williamson.

To the Marietta Old School-Returned Minutes.

5th. Called for contributions sent up by the churches, and received for minutes \$24.50 and for the visiting ministry \$67.50.

6th. Appointed Union Meetings as follows:

1st. With Ebenezer Church, Upson county, Ga., ten miles west from Culloden, S. R. R., commencing on Friday before the fifth Sunday in May, 1904.

2d. With Mount Paran Church, Crawford county, Ga., on Friday before the fifth Sunday in July, 1904. The church is situated three miles west from Lizella, M. & B. R. R.

7th. Appointed the next session of this body to convene with Bethlehem Church, in the city of Macon, commencing on Friday before the third Sunday in September, 1904.

8th. Agreed to have 1,200 copies of these Minutes printed and distributed in the usual manner.

9th. Called for the Corresponding Letter, which was read and adopted.

10th. Read minutes, and after prayer by Eld. I. Grant, of the body, adjourned.

Sunday A. M. — Eld. W. C. Cleveland, followed by Eld. Morgan Brown, both from the body.

Sunday P. M.—Eld. D. F. Woodall, from the Upatoie.

Closed by Eld. W. W. Childs, of the body.

DECORUM.

- 1. The Association shall be composed of members chosen by the churches in our union and duly sent to represent them in the Association, who shall be members whom they judge best qualified for that purpose, producing letters from their churches certifying their appointment, shall be entitled to seats.
- 2. In the letters from the churches shall be expressed their members in full fellowship, those baptized, received by letter, on confession of faith, dismissed, excommunicated and died since last Association.
- 3. The members thus chosen and convened shall be denominated the Echeconnee Association, providing for themselves a Moderator and Clerk, who will serve them during the session; using the pastor of the church where they assemble or choosing one from the body, as they please.
- 4. As one of the cardinal tenets of faith of the Primitive Baptists is that the Old and New Testaments are our only rule of faith and practice, and as the Bible recognizes no other religious disciplinary power but the Church, we hereby leave all discipline with the Church, where God in His wisdom, mercy, and in honor to His Son, placed it.
- 5. If new churches desire to be admitted into this union they may petition by letter and delegates, and if found orthodox and orderly, shall be received by the Association and manifested by the Moderator giving the delegates the right hand of fellowship.
- 6. The names of the members of the Association shall be enrolled by the Clerk, and called over as often as the Association may require.
- 7. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a true record of the proceedings of the Association.
- 8. The minutes of the Association shall be read and signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the Association adjourns.
- 9. Amendments to this form of government may be made at any time by a majority of the union, when they deem it necessary.
 - 10. To correspond with sister Associations of the same faith and order.
- 11. The Association shall have power to adjourn themselves to any future time or place they may think most convenient to the churches in the union.
- 12. It is also agreed that nothing shall be so construed in the above as to interfere with the fellowship and communion of the churches or brethren of this union, or with those with whom we may correspond, directly or indirectly; and nothing shall be presented to this body as a query, or question bearing on the same, but shall be considered by the churches, as we believe is directed by the Holy Scriptures.

ARTICLES OF FAITH.

1st. We believe in one true and living God, and that there are three persons in the Godhead—the Father, the Son and the Holy Ghost.

2d. We believe the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are the word of God, and the only rule of faith and practice.

3d. We believe in the doctrine of eternal and particular election.

4th. We believe in the doctrine of original sin.

5th. We believe in man's impotency to recover himself from the fallen state he is in by nature, by his own free will and ability.

6th. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God only by the imputed righteousness of Christ.

7th. We believe that God's elect shall be called, regenerated and sanctified by the Holy Ghost.

8th. We believe that Saints shall persevere in grace, and never finally

fall away.

9th. We believe that Baptism, and the Lord's Supper are ordinances of Jesus Christ, and that true believers are the only subjects of these ordinances. We believe that immersion is baptism.

10th. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, and a general judgment.

11th. We believe that the punishment of the wicked will be eternal, and the joys of the righteous will be everlasting.

12th. We believe that no minister has a right to the administration of the ordinances, only such as are regularly called and come under the imposition of the hands of the presbytery.
