

A Word From The President

The president does not intend to have a regular column in the Newsline. Nevertheless, once in a while it does seem to be the best place to communicate with the student body. There are a couple of matters that need our consideration.

Anonymity is always cowardly. Periodically someone receives an anonymous letter. Only under the rarest circumstances is such a letter positive. Usually the intent of the letter is criticism. In recent weeks one student has received an anonymous phone call from another student offering criticism and even suggesting that the student receiving the phone call should leave school. Now here is the point: Even if the criticism of an anonymous letter or phone call is correct, it is rendered useless by anonymity. To remain anonymous is a cowardly act because it presents no opportunity for response on the part of the individual subject to the criticism. Unless you yourself want to be the recipient of anonymous phone calls and letters, make up your mind now that you will never be the perpetrator of such acts. And by the way, if you receive a telephone call from an anonymous source who refuses to identify himself, simply hang up. If you receive a letter from an anonymous source, simply put it in "File 13." Such letters and phone calls are unworthy of the time you would spend with them.

Dress Code. The president does not have much of a tendency toward Phariseeism. However, it is imperative that we be decent in our apparel and observe some common courtesies. The wearing of baseball caps in chapel or class is not acceptable. Also, the president would like to request that students not wear shorts either in chapel or class. This is not a request for formal attire (except on rare occasions), but much is at stake in terms of student recruitment, fund raising, and the appropriate decorum for class and chapel.
