
Board was organized accordingly. The following general officers were elected:

Chairman Tom Brandon, Texas Vice-Chairman Frank Campbell, N. C. Treasurer Edgar Wyatt, N. C. Secretary John Howell, Ky.

A ten-member Executive Committee of the Board was elected. on the Executive Committee come from seven states, thus assuring a broad base of representation.

The Trustees acted on the following items during their meeting:

- Authorized an Associate level degree for the work now designated as Certificate in Theology.
- Authorized Certificates in Building and Loan to be invested on four year rotation basis as they become available.
- Received \$1,000.00 from the Estate of Mrs. Flonie Cooper 3. Williams for General Endowment.
- Received \$500.00 from William Neely to set up a Student Loan Fund in the name of William and Wanda Neely.
- Received \$1,000.00 from the Estate of Mr. Dougal Gray McMillan for establishment of a Student Aid Fund in his father's name.
- Received \$6,085.40 from Mr. and Mrs. Harold C. Fechner to endow the Carver-Barnes Lectureship.
- Appointed W. Alan Tuttle as Associate Librarian and Director of Technical Services and a Special Instructor in Bibliography.
- Designated funds from Cooperative Program Overage (\$143,652.76) to Urban Studies Center, Special Projects in Operation and Maintenance, and Special Projects in Administrative, General, and Academic Areas. Particular projects to be approved by the administration.
- Authorized the establishment of a 30-member Development Council. Appointment to the Council will be subject to approval by the administration.
- Accepted a challenge gift of \$100,000 by a N. C. family, who prefer to remain anonymous, and mandated immediate plans to match the gift \$2.00 to \$1.00 for a Professorship in Evangelism.
- 11. Increased the diploma fee by \$2.00.
- Increased the fee for M.Div./M.R.E. apparel by \$2.50; 12. D.Min. apparel by \$1.50.
- Amended the Articles of Incorporation of the Seminary in nomenclature of general officers: President to Chairman, and Vice-President to Vice-Chairman.
- 14. Approved a \$50.00 fee per two hour course for matriculation in the Urban Studies Center applicable to seminary graduates and M.Div. candidates from other schools.

assuring an adequate corpus.

Immediate plans are underway to shape our response to this significant challenge. The Trustees intend to develop their particular response during the March, 1977 meeting of the Board. Hopefully, administration, faculty, students, and alumni will participate in the response.
