




### MINUTES

Mt. Zion Church, Clark County, Georgia, Oct. 8, 1915.

The introductory sermon was preached by Elder S. A. Huff. Text, Isaiah 8:20. To the law and to the testamony.

After an hour's intermission the messengers met.

Chose Elder L. M. Chandler Moderator pro-tem. Received and read the letters from the churches.

On motion elected Elder L. M. Chandler, Moderator and Elder J. M. Adams Clerk.

Invited visiting brethren to seats with us. Opened the door for petitionary churches.

On motion adopted the arrangement of business of last year.

Appointed a committee to arrange preaching to-wit:

H. P. Adair, A. T. Mitchell, J. B. Rogers, G. T. Whitworth, and J. W. Breedlove.

Appointed Elder D. P. Smith, J. D. Malcom and G. T.

Whitworth to write the corresponding letter.

Called for miscellan eous business.

On motion adopted a resolution on the death of our former Moderator, Elder C. H. Anthony, as follows: Elder C. H. Anthony was chosen Moderator Oct. 10, 1902., died April the 9th, 1915, being the ninth Moderator since the organization of this body. He was efficient in the duties of the office. Sound in the faith, we feel that the chief Shepherd did appear and gave him that crown of glory that fadeth not away. We extend our sympathy to his widow and family.

Also discontinued the name of Rutledge church as they

had dissolved.

Also agreed to ask each of our churches to help put up a fifty dollar tomb to Elder C. H. Anthony's grave by our next meeting.

Appointed Brethren D. P. Smith, J. B. Rogers and W. G. David to draft some resolutions on the deaths of those who have

died.

Appointed Union Meetings as follows:

First District with the church at Monroe on the fifth Sunday and Friday before in April, 1916. Second District with the church at Big Creek on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday after the third Sunday in July, 1916.

Appointed the next session of our body to sit with the church at Union, Madison county, on the usual time, Friday be-

fore the second Sunday in October, 1916.

Appointed J. S. Fleeman, A. T. Mitchell and W. H. Haralson to receive contributions.

Called the roll and received contributions and directed the Clerk to have 1000 copies printed and distributed in the usual way.

On motion voted our thanks to the brethren and sisters and friends for their hospitality while we have been with them.

Read and adopted the minutes.

#### CIRCULAR LETTER.

The Oconee Association, in session with the church at Mt. Zion church, Clarke County, Ga., October the 8th, 9th and 10th, 1915, to the churches and Associations with which we corres-

pond:

Dear Brethren: —In addressing you in this Circular Letter it is to set forth the truth as it is in Christ Jesus. John 3-16 will give us a subject: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." God is love, and He made the world and all of His work was good. Man was made good, but by him came sin and by sin came death upon all the Adamic family. Hence it was necessary for God to send His Son in the world. Isaiah tells us over seven hundred years before He was born, saying unto us a Son is given. He also says "Behold a virgin shall bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel." We find Matthew saying, "It was fulfilled according to the prophet," and the angel told Joseph "His wite shall have a son and His name shall be called Jesus, for He shall save His people from their sins."

Now we have the only Son of God. A voice was heard out of a cloud, saying, "This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased; hear ye Him." He says in this chapter, "Except a man

be born again he cannot see the kingdom of God."

"My meat is to do the will of Him that sent me, and to finish His work, I came not to do my will, but the will of Him that sent me, and this is the will of him which sent me, that of all which he has given me I should lose nothing, but raise it up again at the last day. This is the work of God that ye believe on Him whom he hath sent. "He that believeth on me hath everlasting life." "No man can come to me except the Father which hath sent me draw him." "All that the Father giveth me shall come to me." "Ye will not come to me that ye might have life." "Ye believe not because ve are not of my sheep." "My sheep hear my voice and I know them, and I give unto them eternal life, and they shall never perish." "Glorify thy Son thou hast given him power over all flesh that he should give eternal life to as many as thou hast given him. I have

finished the work which thou gavest me to do."

This embraces the doctrine of the only Son of God and it will be received by the royal family of God who believe in the son. The Jews do not believe in Him, hence they teach their children to know the Lord. Yet their unbelief will not hinder any of the redeemed from receiving that inheritance that is reserved in heaven for them who are kept by the power of God, for this Son of God has the keys of death and hell.

So dear brethren, let us continue to contend that salvation is by grace through faith and that not of yourselves it is the gift of God, not of works, lest any man should boast, discarding that the only Son of God did his part and left a part for us or the church to do, making our part as essential as that of his.

May we praise God from whom all blessings flow.
