

Dr. Fred Sandusky has drawn the bottom line for fall enrollment following the final day for adding/dropping courses. The total is 1246.

This compares to 1215 for the fall, 1979 - a 2.5% increase. Every apartment is filled and 18 families live in a Northern Raleigh apartment complex under a negotiated rental agreement.

The students this fall come from 29 states and 6 countries overseas. They graduated from 201 colleges and universities. The entering class numbers 331; 70.3% are married, and 60% of them have one child. There are 930 children in student families this fall. One hundred eighty-nine (189) women are enrolled.
