Dear Seminary Family and Friends:

Andy Morris, a second-year student at Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary, has passed through the valley of the shadow of death. He is presently recovering from Guillain-Barre Syndrome, a disease involving temporary degeneration of the nerves and often causing paralysis.

On November 14, 1980, Andy woke up with numbress in his legs, and two days later he was almost completely paralyzed up to his neck. Immediately, he was placed on a respirator, and three days later a tracheotomy was performed. Andy remained in this acute condition first in Maximum Care Unit of Rex Hospital, then in MCU of Duke Medical Center for more than two months. He is now slowly recovering in the Rehabilitation Center of Duke Medical Center. Andy is regaining the use of his body through strenuous physical therapy and personal determination.

The medical expenses incurred during Andy's illness have been astronomical. Before he became qualified for Medicaid his medical expenses, after his insurance as a seminary student was exhausted, totaled slightly more than \$50,000.00.

This letter is a personal appeal to you the members of the seminary family -- students, faculty, administrative staff, trustees, public relations council, development council, alumni -- pastors, and friends to join with me now in raising \$50,000.00 to liquidate Andy's indebtedness. If each of us and our fellow Christians make generous contributions, Andy and Pam can be relieved quickly of such a sudden and staggering financial responsibility.

Andy's illness has affected positively the spiritual growth and development of literally thousands of Christians. Andy, Pam and their family, members of the Athens Drive Baptist Church where Andy is Minister of Children and Youth, the seminary family, hundreds of Christians from Alabama to Maryland, Christians on the overseas mission fields -- all of these and countless others have grown in the grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ through the fellowship of suffering. New insights have been gained concerning the providence of God, miracles, the community of saints and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, ministry as giving and receiving, self-centeredness and Christ-centeredness, and the mystery of suffering love -- human and divine. These spiritual "giant-steps," made under extreme and unforeseen adversity, have given new courage and purpose to many of us.

To God be the glory both for Andy's recovery and for the host of friends who have responded to his desperate physical and financial situation.
