



The Board of Trustees met on campus October 11-12. The following officers were elected for the year:

Among the actions of the trustees were these:

- Approved Wheat Investment Advisors and First Union Trust Division as investments managers for the seminary endowment funds.
- Approved seven capital requests from the SBC 1984-88.
- Granted tenure to Dr. Claude Y. Stewart, Jr., Associate Professor of Systematic Theology.
- Approved a functional design for Ledford Student Center.
- Approved a general campus lighting plan to be implemented as funds are available.
- Elected twelve new directors for the Southeastern Seminary Foundation, Inc.
- Approved:
 - the Ben C. Fisher Endowment Fund for Student Aid
 - the Annie W. Cole Endowment Fund for Financial Aid to Foreign Students
 - the Joshua Franklin and Mamie Rosson Barnes Endowment Fund for Student Aid
 - the Joe F. Hayes, Jr. Endowment Fund for Student Aid
 - the John Davies and G. Henton Davies Old Testament Award Endowment Fund
 - the Mackie Landscaping Endowment Fund
- Approved in concept the funding of a fulltime chaplain/counselor.

An emphasis on world hunger, largely student sponsored, was held on campus, October 11-15. A variety of seminars, visuals, and activities were designed to heighten the sensitivity of the entire seminary community to this severe and growing human problem.
