# THE GUEST LECTURER

Dr. Russell F. Aldwinckle, Professor of Systematic Theology at McMaster Divinity College since 1947, was born in Leicester, England. He is a graduate of the Universities of London (B.A., 1933), Oxford (M.A., 1936), and Strasbourg (D.Th., 1938). Prior to his appointment at McMaster he served as minister to Baptist churches at Hearsall, Coventry, and at North Finchley, London.

In 1955 Professor Aldwinckle was awarded a Lord Nuffield grant for summer research in Oxford and Europe. In 1959-60 he was given a senior fellowship by the Canada Council and a second fellowship by the American Association of Theological Schools. Granted leave by the Divinity College, he spent the year in Oxford, with visits to Strasbourg and Basel and met such notable figures as Karl Barth and Carl Jung. He is a former Chairman of the Faith and Order Commission of the Canadian Council of Churches and is at present a member of the Faith and Order Commission of the World Council of Churches. In that capacity he attended the Assembly of the Council in Uppsala, Sweden.

Professor Aldwinckle serves on the editorial committee of the <u>Canadian Journal of</u> <u>Theology</u> and of McMaster's <u>Theological</u> <u>Bulletin</u>. He has contributed numerous articles to learned journals.

He has served as a deacon of James Street Baptist Church, Hamilton.

On his visit to Wake Forest, Professor Aldwinckle is accompanied by his son, David, a teacher in Ottawa.
