PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES
FOR APARTMENT RESIDENTS:

Students living in unfurnished apartments are required to go to City Hall in Wake Forest to list Personal Property Tax during the month of January. The value you can use for determining the amount of taxes due on furniture is:

\$5,400--One bedroom apartment
\$7,200--Two bedroom apartment
\$9,000--Three bedroom apartment
\$3,600--Simmons apartment

You have an option of listing your personal property or accepting 10% of the value of the apartment. This would be as follows:

One bedroom--\$540
Two bedroom--\$720
Three bedroom--\$900
