a course of experience has induced us to  
believe that order becomes the house  
of God and for the promotion of his  
cause we are led to adopt the following

1) rules

This church shall chose a preacher  
and clerk at the end of every year the  
clerk shall keep a minit of each  
conference and read it to the church be-  
fore it closes and record the same in the  
church book and keep it carefully

2) The preacher shall be considered mod-  
erator when present and in good order  
and when absent the church shall  
chose another

3) It is the duty of the moderator to  
invite brothers and sisters of our faith  
and order to seats with us and open  
the door of the church for the reception  
of members then call for references  
and inquire for the fellowship of the  
church and call for acknowledgments  
and to preserve order while in conference

4) Every motion made and seconded shall  
be considered unless withdrawn by the  
one who made it

5) Every allegation against a member

6) It is deemed disorder for a member  
to withdraw in time of conference  
without permission or to interrupt  
another while speaking

7) A member wishing to speak should  
rise to his feet and address the moder-

more than three times without permission

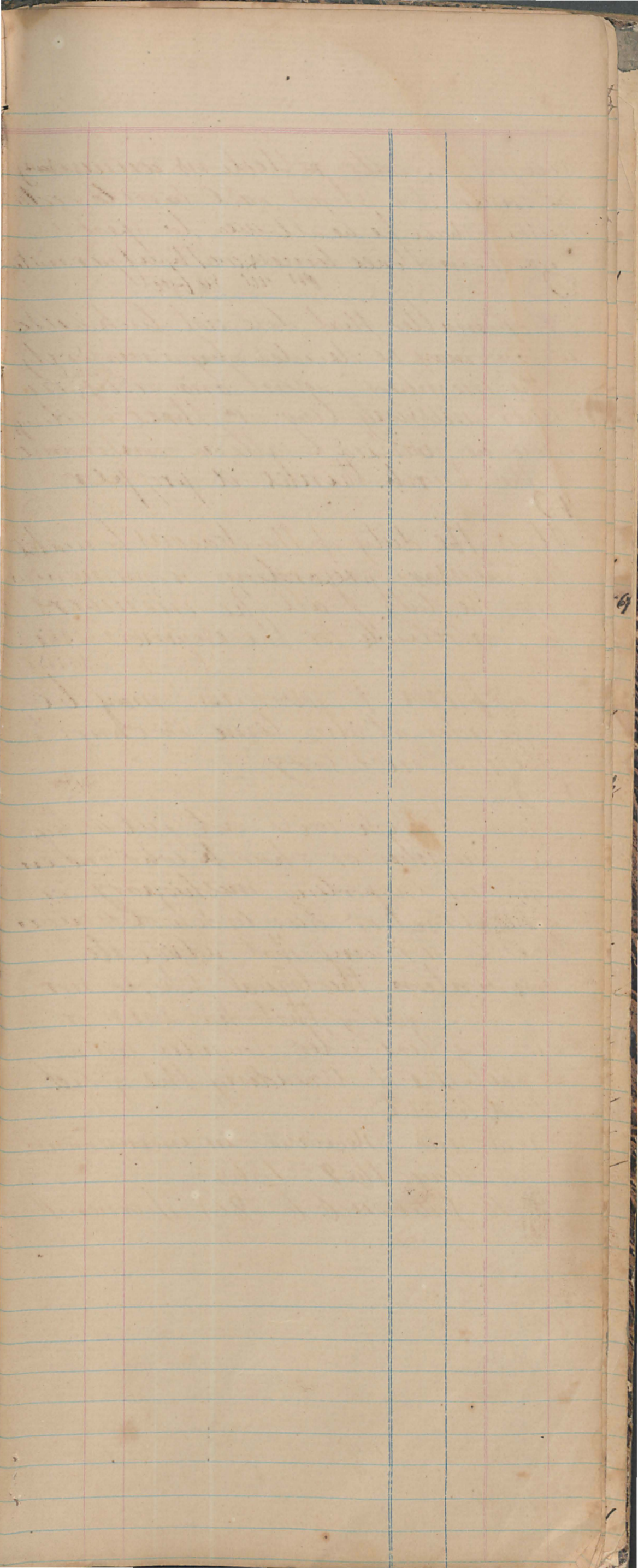

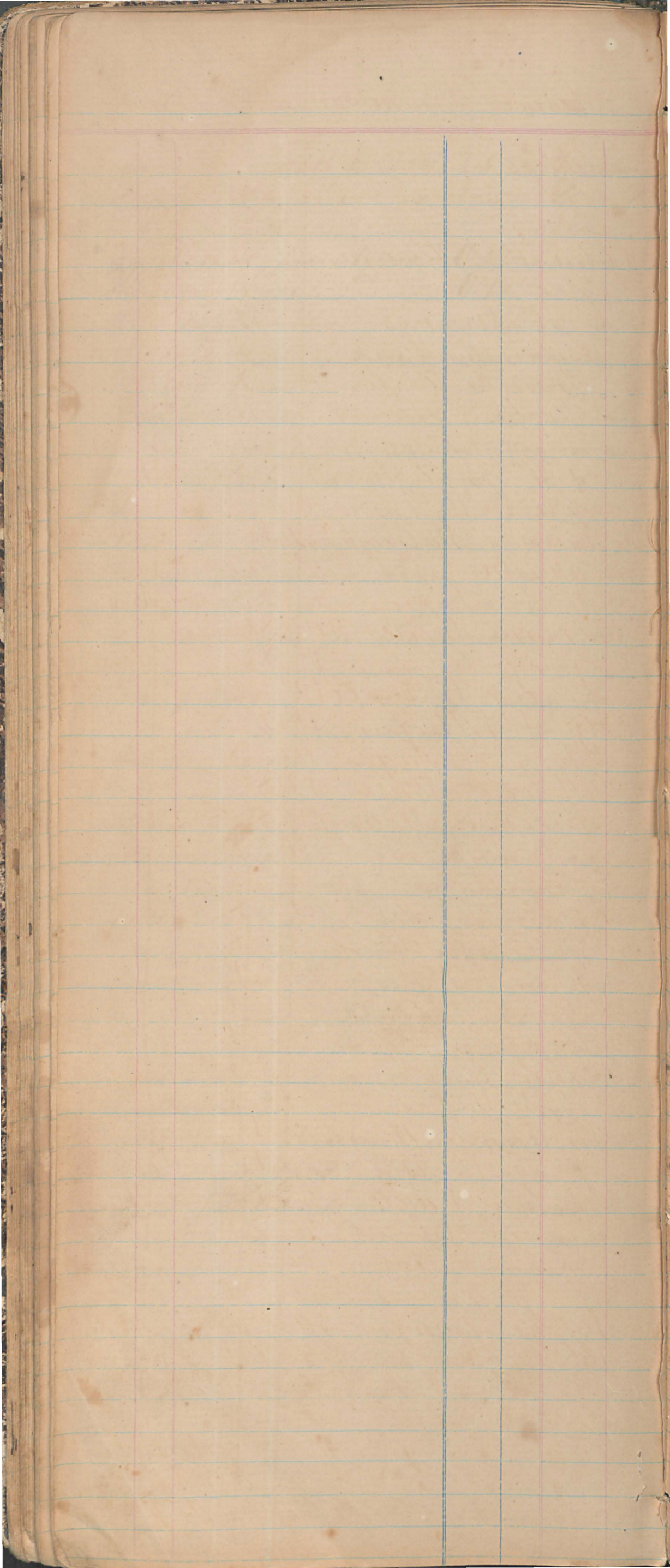
