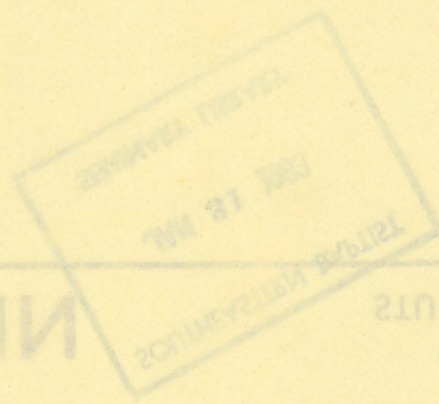
CHILDCARE NOTICE:
