Four significant capital projects are nearing completion. They

(1) HERITAGE WOODS. This 25 lot are: CAPITAL subdivision is now complete. The final PROJECTS plat has been approved by the Town of Wake Forest. The lots will be available

to seminary personnel as home sites. The seminary will retain first right to purchase upon sale of improvements on the property.

(2) <u>PLANT SERVICES ADDITION</u>. Almost 4000 square feet have been added to the Plant Services Building. The space will be used to house shops and warehousing. Central Builders, Rocky Mount, constructed the building. It was given to the seminary by Gene Williams and the company. Gene is an alumnus of Southeastern. The formal presentation will come as a part of Spring Convocation, January 20.

(3) <u>REECE HOUSE</u>. This facility is a two-bedroom guest apartment refurbished and furnished by Dennis and Augusta Hockaday in memory of Augusta's parents. It will substantially relieve space in the Manor for use by visiting students while providing adequate facilities for four seminary guests (lecturers, etc.) at a time. Dennis is a 1954 alumnus, a member of Southeastern's first graduating class.

(4) <u>BROYHILL HALL</u>. Lea Lab is nearing complete renovation and furnishing for multi-purpose usage. When completed it will be dedicated as Broyhill Hall in honor of J. E. Broyhill and his son, Paul, and their families. Both of these have served as Southeastern trustees.

The dedication of Broyhill Hall is

scheduled for March 9.

Southeastern's computer was delivered the week of December 22. The sophisticated MICRO DATA system is at work. The payroll is already "on COMPUTER line." Other cost centers are scheduled for computerization within weeks. Jim McManus, Director of Financial Services, and Grace Dean, Personnel Clerk, have worked miracles already.

The spring semester begins January 20 with prospects for another record enrollment. Dr. Robert Richardson, Associate Professor of Supervised Ministry, SPRING TERM will deliver the Convocation Address in
