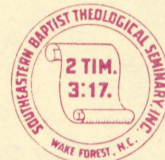

SPECIAL LIBRARY WORKSHOP: Entering students and interested persons are invited to participate in a special Library workshop in the AV Auditorium, 2nd floor of the Library, on Wednesday, Jan. 16 from 3:00 PM - 5:00 PM. Methods and materials for more effective use of the seminary library will be demonstrated. Advance registration at the Circulation or Reference Desk by Tues., Jan. 15 would be helpful.

KEESEEE DEADLINE: Students preparing for ministries with Southern Baptists and who were residents of VA or NC prior to entering SEBTS may apply for assistance from the Charles B. Keeseee Educational Fund. To be considered for maximum assistance, students must be enrolled fulltime (10 hours-M.Div., MRE; 12 hours-A.Div.). Students enrolled for at least 6 hours, but not fulltime, are eligible to be considered for 1/2 of the usual maximum assistance. No Keeseee aid is available for students enrolled for less than 6 hours. Applications must be received in the Keeseee offices no later than March 1 for the 1985-86 academic year. Seminary supplies of applications are usually quickly depleted and should not be expected to be available as the deadline approaches.

PROPERTY TAX LISTING: Students living in seminary housing and owning personal property are subject to county and city tax assessments. The deadline to list property for 1985 is Jan. 31. A 10% late listing fee will be imposed for listings made after this date. Personal property for city and county taxes may be listed by mail or in person. PRISON MINISTRY INTERNSHIPS: Two internships in prison ministry are available from June 1985 - May 1986 at Central Prison and Women's Correctional Center in Raleigh. The internships will begin in the summer with a unit of CPE at Women's Correctional Center (40 hours per week) and will continue through the academic year (20 hours per week) at Women's or Central.
