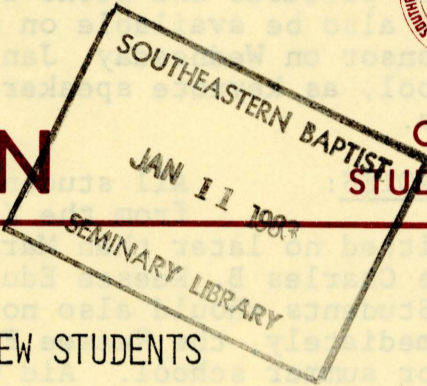

SUMMER INTERNSHIP: Interviews will be held on Feb. 10 for an internship at the Emerywood Baptist Church in High Point, NC. This will be for 10 weeks, beginning June 1. Previous experience in working with these groups would be advantageous. The summer associate (intern) functions as a member of the pastoral team and will be integrated into the total ministry of the church". The student selected for this position may take Supervised Ministry during the summer session and this will count as his/her field work.
