


Accreditation

Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary is accredited by the Association of Theological Schools (ATS) in the United States and Canada. Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) to award associate, masters and doctoral degrees. The Seminary has been accredited by ATS since 1958 and by SACS since 1978.

Admission

Students applying for admission to degree programs who plan to begin studies in any term of Summer School should follow the admission instructions as outlined in the 1993-94 Catalog, pg. 10, and register on the designated days.

Applications for admission to Summer School on any other basis should be received in the Admissions Office at least fifteen days prior to registration date. Curriculum

The curriculum consists of courses for students continuing in the A.Div., M.Div., M.A./C.E., M.A./C.M., and D. Min. programs. Applications for admission to Summer School with special student status are welcomed from alumni or others who want to pursue post-degree studies.

The maximum load permitted is one course per term. Students cannot enroll in two courses that overlap at any time.

Classes meet four days a week, Tuesday through Friday, unless otherwise cited. Catalog prerequisites for Summer School courses are waived, except as noted. Students are encouraged to consider carefully their level of proficiency when selecting electives in areas where no previous formal study has been done.

The Seminary reserves the right to limit the size of classes in order to maintain a reasonable student-teacher ratio or to cancel a course if enrollment is not sufficient.

In addition to courses offered on campus, students may earn up to eight semester hours' credit for the completion of a basic unit of Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) at an accredited training center as provided in the 1993-94 Catalog, pg. 59. In order to receive credit, the student must register with the Registrar and pay the Business Office prior to the beginning of the program, and the supervisor must file a grade report at the conclusion of the course (M4360 - M4361 and M4362 - M4363).

Registration

Students who have preregistered and paid matriculation fees in the Business Office need only to

report to summer classes on the appointed day and time. New students or returning students who have not preregistered or have not paid the matriculation fee must register for the classes on or before the first day of class as listed below unless otherwise noted.

Classes meet Tuesday through Friday at 8:00 a.m. - 9:40, 10:15 - 12:00 unless otherwise noted.

Fees

The matriculation fee for all courses is \$50 per semester hour for SBC students, \$100 per hour for non-SBC students. (1993-94 Catalog, pg. 11).

The fee for auditing a Summer School course is \$25.

These fees are not refundable after 4:30 p.m. on the first day of class. The cost of books and supplies varies depending on courses taken.

In addition to matriculation fees, professors may also collect additional fees for supplies, travel expenses, etc. necessary to complete the courses.

In addition to the matriculation fee, each Summer School student will be charged a Summer School Student Services Fee of \$10. (1993-94 Catalog, pg. 11).

Withdrawal

Withdrawal from a course without penalty is permitted until 4:30 p.m., midway through the term. Students wishing to withdraw from a course or from enrollment should consult with the Registrar for guidance.

Housing

Inquiries concerning housing accommodations for the summer terms should be directed to the Director of Housing. Dormitory rental rates for Johnson and Lolley Halls are \$120 for double occupancy and \$150 for private rooms. Duplex apartments are \$250 per month for a one-bedroom apartment, \$260 per month for two bedrooms, and \$270 per month for three bedrooms. The Townhouse apartments are \$285 per month for two bedrooms and \$300 per month for three bedrooms. Commuter rooms are available at \$7 per night.
